

Further Interrogatories, with the Answers to the same, put to Wm. W. Johnston in the matter relating to the Eastern Shore Rail Road, by the Select Committee charged with that subject.

What amount of money was in your hands as treasurer of the Eastern Shore Rail Road Company at the time of your last statement to a committee of the House of Delegates, at December session 1839?

Answer.—The amount in my hands as treasurer of the Eastern Shore Rail Road Company, in a statement made to the committee of the House of Delegates at December session 1838, (to which I presume the committee alludes) I find on reference to said statement, to be \$12,019 54.

What amount have you received from private stockholders since that date, stating the names and the amount received from each?

Answer.—I have not the means at hand to enable me to state.

What amount have you received from the State, and what disbursements have been made by you, stating as far as practicable the items of your disbursements, and what amount have you now on hand?

Answer.—The amount received from the State is fifteen thousand dollars. The disbursements of money are shewn in a statement herewith submitted, and to which the committee is respectfully referred. I cannot state the amount in my hands for the reason above given, but would remark that it is very small.
