The committee then adjourned.

MARCH 5th, 1839.

The committee met. Present Messrs. Wootton, Pitts, Handy, Blocher and Comegys.

Mr. McCulloh was sent for, and asked further time to prepare his answers which had been propounded to him on 16th ult.; he was allowed three days. Some interrogatories* were prepared by Mr. McCulloh, which he requested the committee to propound to the various individuals alluded to in his interrogatories. The committee postpone any action on them until after Mr. McCulloh had handed in his answers.

Committee adjourned.

SATURDAY, March 9th.

Committee met. Present Messrs. Pitts, Handy, Comegys and Blocher.

James W. McCulloh appeared, and requested the committee to grant him further time to prepare his answers. The committee allowed the witness until Monday morning 10 o'clock, with the understanding that no further time would be allowed.

The committee then adjourned till Monday morning 10 o'clock.

MARCH 13th.

The committee met. Present Messrs. Wootton, Pitts, Handy, Blocher and Comegys.

James W. McCulloh appeared before the committee and requested a further extension of time to enable him to prepare his answers to the interrogatories which were propounded to him on the 15th ult. The committee allowed him until to-morrow at 10 o'clock, at which time he assured the committee his answers should be presented.

MARCH 14th.

Committee met. Present same as on yesterday, except Mr. Comegys.

James W. McCulloh appeared and handed in his answer to some of the interrogatories propounded to him, and had until to-morrow to prepare the remainder.
