Deducting from this excess, the residue of the State's special deposits in the Union Bank of Maryland and the Franklin bank of Baltimore	149,067 42
There will yet remain an excess beyond the the available means of the Treasury, which must be provided for in the course of the present year of	471,034 40
The revenue derived from ordinary and permanent sources, other than on account of the States advances to works of internal improvement, amounted during the same time, to	255,678 22
And the disbursements other than for interest on the public debt and advances to works of internal improvements, to	259,468 47
Leaving an excess of disbursements for the ordinary support of government over and above its ordinary revenue	3,790 25
The revenue to be derived during the current year, from ordinary and permanent sources, as above mentioned, is estimated to amount to	231,905 53
The probable demands on the Treasury, other than for interest on the public debt and for the support of free schools, which are charged on the receipts from the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company, are estimated at	241,845 67
Which leaves an estimated deficit for the ordinary purposes of government during the present year of	9,940 14

The conclusion from these estimates is that the ordinary revenue is rather less in amount than the ordinary expenses of the Treasury, but considering the fluctuating character of both revenues and expenses and the gradual increase in certain branches of the revenue and the experience of former years, your committee believe that by the exercise of a prudent economy on the part of the Legislature, the necessity for a resort
