The Honorable JOHN J. GRAVES,

*Chairman Com. Ways and Means, Ho. Del.—Annapolis :*

SIR,—I had the honor to address you on the 21st instant, and having since noticed in the public prints, that a recent correspondence between the Messrs. Baring and the canal company was before the Legislature, I addressed a letter on the 24th instant to General McNeal, the president of the company, on the subject of that correspondence to be communicated to the Legislature. I yesterday received a letter from Messrs. Baring to the canal company, dated the 3rd instant, which, as it embraces subjects interesting to the company and the State, it has appeared to me should also be laid before the Legislature.

As there might be some delay in the case of the absence of the officers of the canal company, in the letters being received at Annapolis, and as various matters in which Messrs. Baring are interested, appear to be pending before the House of Delegates, I have thought best to send to you, sir, copies of these letters, for the purpose of their being communicated to the Legislature; which I herewith enclose, and if I have made a mistake in forwarding them to you, I pray you to excuse it, and to place them in the proper hands for the above purpose.
