That it appears to your committee, there remained in the treasury as of the 11th January, 1844, the balance of one hundred and eleven thousand and fifty-four dollars and forty-five cents, which they find, on that day stood to his credit as treasurer in the Farmers' Bank of Maryland, and which was duly paid over by him to D. Claude, Esq., the present treasurer, and for which payment he has also produced to your committee a satisfactory voucher.

Your Committee further report, that they have also examined the proceedings and documents of the said late treasurer in reference to the following funds confided to his care, and find from an account settled to the 1st December, 1843, by your committee, there then remained in the treasury to the credit of those funds, twenty six thousand and fifteen dollars and ninety-seven cents in cash.
