NOTE.—Upon the articles of Dry Goods (foreign and domestic,) Hardware, Queensware, Groceries generally, Drugs and Medicines, Paints and Dyestuffs, the charge will hereafter be, until otherwise directed, at the rate of 35 cents per 100 lbs. from Baltimore to Cumberland, mixed merchandize, when in entire car loads, 35 cents per 100 lbs. Upon American Tobacco in hhds. or bales, and upon chewing tobacco in boxes in either direction between Cumberland and Baltimore, the charge will be at the rate of 25 cents per 100 lbs. Shorts and Shipstuff at a mean rate between the 3d and 4th classes of the Tariff. The clause of the Tariff which subjects all
