COURT HOUSE OF BALTIMORE CITY AND COUNTY, }  
*Baltimore, September 16, 1852.* }

According to previous arrangement, the Commissioners appointed by virtue of an Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, entitled an Act to provide for the valuation and severance of the Ownership of Property now held jointly by the City and County of Baltimore, chapter 357, passed May 31st, 1852, met at the Court House in the city of Baltimore.

Present on the part of Baltimore County :

Thomas B. Cockey, Joshua Hutchins, Joab Bernard.

Present on the part of Baltimore City :

Christian Keener, Fielding Lucas, Jr., N. T. Dushane.

Upon motion of Mr. Bernard,

Mr. Lucas, Jr., was elected Chairman of the Commissioners.

The Commissioners of Baltimore County presented their credentials, and the Commissioners for the City also having been first duly qualified,

On motion of Mr. Dushane,

Proceeded to ballot for Clerk, when John L. Stansbury received a majority of the votes, and was duly elected, and informed thereof by Mr. Bernard. Mr. Stansbury appeared and was duly qualified, according to law, and entered upon the discharge of his duties.

On motion of Mr. Dushane,

Ordered, That the Clerk be authorised to purchase such book as may be necessary for the record of proceedings of said Board.

On motion of Mr. Keener,

Resolved, That the Clerk make examination of records, &c., such as may give the necessary information regarding the title of the property held jointly between Baltimore City and Baltimore County.

On motion of Mr. Bernard,

Resolved, That the President be authorised to call the Board
