

At which said 21<sup>st</sup> day of October anno Dom 1752  
 Came again the said Parties Appellants and Appellee  
 by their Procurators at Law and all the Commissioners being  
 met the said Commission with the whole Proceedings  
 from the Commissarys Court being read in presence of  
 the Council Learned on both sides appeared to be as  
 before recited and set forth. Whereupon and upon  
 reading the Bill Answer and Depositions taken and  
 published in this Cause and also the Decree in the  
 Proceedings mentioned made by the Commissary Genl.  
 and upon Debate of the Matter and hearing what  
 could be Alleged both on the Part of the Appellants &  
 Appellee, this Court doth order Determine Adjudge &  
 decree and it is this present day Ordered determined  
 Adjudged and Decreed that the Decree or Sentence  
 made by the Commissary General be revoked annulled  
 and for nothing held and that the will of the said John  
 Gibb in the Proceedings set forth be hereby established  
 and made firm and Valid, and that the same shall be  
 so held and deemed and that the Letters Testamentary  
 granted to James Mafsey and John Hadley Executors  
 of the Will of John Gibb be confirmed and made Valid  
 and of full force anything in the said Commissary  
 Generals Decree or Sentence to the contrary notwithstanding  
 and that the Administration granted on the Estate  
 of the said John Gibb by the Commissary General in  
 Virtue of his Sentence or Decree be revoked and made  
 Null and Void and of no Effect and that the same be so  
 held deemed and taken And for as much as the  
 Appeal from the Decree or Sentence of the Commissary  
 General was granted upon the Petition of the Negroes  
 in and by the Will of the said John Gibb Manumitted &  
 Set free and not on the Petition of the Executors of the  
 said Will, and the said Negroes in Case the said Decree
