Executrix of George Norman to make  
over Two Tracts of Land to John Gadby

Whereas George Norman late of Baltimore County  
planter did in the Year of our Lord 1690 Bargain and Sell  
unto John Gadby of Ann Arundel County planter Two  
Tracts of Land lying and being in Ann Arundel County on  
the North Side of Severn River the one called Hopkins  
Tracy Containing one hundred acres and the other called  
Normans Tracy Containing Twenty five acres contiguous  
and adjoining one to the other and had received the full  
Consideration for the said Land being thirteen Thousand  
Eight hundred pounds of Tobacco and is sufficiently made  
Appear to this Generall Assembly But forasmuch as it  
hath pleased almighty God that the said George  
Norman is deceased and no Covenances or Assurances  
thereof made to the said John Gadby by the said  
George Norman as the Law directs yett by the will of  
the said George his honest Intent appearing that the  
said Two Tracts of Land should be and inure to the sole  
use and behoofe of the said John Gadby his heirs &  
Assignes for ever altho such sufficient power as the  
Law requires doth not seem to be given Elizabeth the  
widow and Executrix of the said George for the making  
and Confirming the two Tracts of Land to the  
said John Gadby his heirs and Assignes for ever, this
