

An Act for the Burgesses Expenses
and other Publick Matters

Resolved by the said Prop. by and with the consent
of the upper and lower house of this present General
Assembly that every County shall satisfy unto their
Respective Burgesses all their necessary Expenses
this Assembly for meals drink and Lodging for themselves
and Charges of boats and hands at their coming hither as
also one hundred pounds of Tobacco into London. To
Mr. Cook, two thousand and Sixty pounds of Tobacco to
George Gaultier one thousand pounds of Tobacco to
Mr. Augustine Freeman three thousand pounds of Tobacco
to Mr. Francis Wright four thousand and Seventy
pounds of Tobacco to Capt. Nicholas Gwyther two thousand
nine hundred and Sixty pounds of Tobacco to Mr. Hoag three
thousand pounds of Tobacco to the Secretary forty to Daniel
Sawyer forty to Mr. Wm. Bond one hundred and fifty
to Mr. Simon Davenport three hundred and thirty to
Mr. Richard Wall six hundred and fifty to Mr. John
Cushman two thousand two hundred to James Jolly for
the charge of the upper house at the Ordinary, six
thousand three hundred and Eighty two pounds of Tobacco
to the said James Jolly for drink and eight hundred
on the Publick being part of the charge of the lower
house to eight hundred and Sixty a hundred Indians two
hundred and Sixty to James Jolly and two thousand
to Mr. Wm. Bond of the lower house one thousand
to Mr. John Gistings of the upper house three
hundred and fifty to Mr. John Powell for officiating
in the lower house five hundred to Mr. George
