equall share of Cattle houses & Mares & moveables To Henry Jarboe
five hundred acres in the branches of S^t. Laurences Creek, one
equall share of the Cattle houses & Mares & Moveables as
said To Mary Jarboe his Daughter the Silver Tankard & his
Spoon, one Negro & an equall share of Cattle houses Mares
household stuffe or moveables To Mary Jarboe his wife the man
one eye & the old woman called Dove & abou by name, & an
share of the moveables, & only the Mare Bonnie & her Colt, of the
houses, his own riding horse to be kept undivided for the use of
Plantacon, upon which Plantacon his wife should live during
her life if she pleased. He desired the Chancero^r & the said John
Jourdaine to manage the Estate of his Children To Edward Bar
he gave a young filly & a Heifer whether he staid with his wife
Children upon the Plantacon or not And he the said Jarboe
then bid the said Jourdaine to take notice that this was his last
in case God Almighty should take him before he could make
W^{ill} in writing, & then said, that the next morning he would
for M^r. Edward Clark & put his W^{ill} in writing, & to M^r. J^ohⁿ
to give him the last Sacrament And likewise declared, that
in case any of his Children dyed before they came to age, that the
W^{ill} was, that that Childs part should be equally divided betwixt
the Mother & the rest of his surviving Children. And in case all
Children dyed before they came to age, he gave his whole Est
to his wife After which & before he the said Jarboe could
his said W^{ill} in writing the said Jarboe dyed, & left his two
younger Sonns in strict rigour of Lawe to the morny of the
elder brother In tender Consideracon therefore of the
distressed Condition of the said younger Brothers, &
Reward of the faithfull services of the said Liort: God
Jarboe to yo^r. Lordps. fathers of noble memory & to yo^r.
allwayes performed, yo^r. Petition & doo humbly pray
