### An Act against Exportation of wooll & old Iron

Whereas the Exportation of wooll and old Iron is generally conceived  
to be much prejudiciall to the common wealth and good of this Province  
Bee it therefore Enacted by the Lord Prop<sup>r</sup> by and with the Consent  
of the upper and lower houses of this present Generall Assembly that  
what person or persons soever shall export or sheepe on board to the  
intent to export out of this Province either wooll or old Iron shall  
for every of their offences in so doing pay as followeth vidz. for  
every pound of wooll fifty pounds of Tobacco and for every  
pound of Iron ten pounds of Tobacco the one half of which said  
payments and forfeitures shall be paid to the Informer and  
the other half to the Lord Proprietary And this Act to continue  
three years or to the end of the next Generall Assembly

### An Act for Repairing the Statthouse

Whereas an Act was made in the forty second Year of the Dominion of  
the R<sup>oy</sup> Hon<sup>ble</sup> Cecilius absolute late Lord and Prop<sup>r</sup> of the Provinces  
of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore &c. of noble  
memory deceased for the Erecting and Building a Statthouse in the City  
of St. Marys which said Statthouse has for want of Repairing gone very  
much
