and port of annapolis the fifth day of September Anno Domini
Seventeen hundred and four Entituled An Act for laying an
Imposition of three pence per hoghead on Tobacco for defraying
the publick Charge of this province and every article clause
matter and thing therein contained shall be and is hereby
utterly repealed and made void. And this present act to
be and endure in full force and strength for the term of three
years and to the End of the next Sessions of a ssembly after the
three years.
