And Whereas by the said Recited Act there is not suffi-
cient provision made to punish such persons as shall neglect

allowed to be made against the bodies of such persons as their goods

Be it therefore Enacted by and with the
advice and Consent aforesaid that from and after the end of this
Session of a Assembly where any person or persons by the
aforesaid Act are subject to be fined by any of Colonels
Lieutenants Colonels Majors or Captains no Execution shall
be made against the body or goods of any such person or persons
but upon Complaint to the Colonels Lieutenants Colonels and
Major or any two of them where such offence is committed and
Complaint made who upon the hearing the Allegations of
both parties shall give judgment thereupon and if need
require shall Execution the forfeiture of the body against
the body or goods of such Delinquent or Delinquents to pay
such fine or fines any Law Statute usage to the contrary
