

An Act for the Naturalization of Herman Kinker a Dutchman & his Children Peter Manadoe a Frenchman and his Children of Cecil County, John Lavielle a Frenchman of Calvert County, James Parandier & John Parandier of Charles County

Be it Enacted by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietor by and with the Advice and Consent of his Lordship's Governor and the upper and lower Houses of Assembly and by the Authority of the Same, that Herman Kinker of Cecil County a Dutchman born in Holland, Peter Manadoe a Frenchman of Cecil County being likewise born under the Dominion of the French King, John Lavielle of Calvert County being likewise born under the Dominion of the French King, James Parandier & John Parandier being likewise born under the Dominion of the French King and all and Every of them and all their Children already born and hereafter to be born within this Province shall forever hereafter be adjudged, deemed and taken as true Lawfull Freeborn Subjects of the Crown of Great Britain within this Province and be & are hereby Enabled to purchase have hold and Enjoy any real Estates of inheritance in this Province and to hold maintain and defend any Action or Actions, real or personal in any his Lordship's Courts of Record of this Province, and to have hold and Enjoy all Privileges and Freedoms whatsoever as any his Majesty's Naturall Subjects of this Province, any Law Usage or Custom to the contrary notwithstanding

An Act for the Relief of Ephraim Gover and to invest him  
with an Estate in fee Simple in the Lands therein Mentioned

Whereas Thomas Holdsworth of Calvert County Gent. Deceased  
for and in Consideration of the Sum of Two hundred pounds Sterling to him  
hand paid by Ephraim Gover of Calvert County planter, did by his last  
bearing date the Seventh Day of April in the Year of our Lord Seventeen  
hundred and Eighteen bind himself in the specialty of four hundred  
pounds Sterl, to Sell and Convey unto the Said Ephraim Gover, his heirs &  
Assigns for ever, three tracts of Land lying in Prince Georges County, one  
called Bear Cought one other called Moshell bank, and the third  
called Bacon Hall containing by Estimation four hundred and  
Twenty Eight Acres in all, with a Special Warranty And Where  
as the Said Thomas Holdsworth afterwards Died Intestate, without  
ever Executing any Conveyance of the premises to the Said Gover according
