 more than effects came to his hands And as will pay and discharge  
 the Other debts remaining due from the said Robert Smiths Estate  
 To which use the said Commissioners are to apply the purchase  
 money of the Lands they shall so sell and to no other use whatsoever  
 and make or cause to be made to any purchaser or purchasers of  
 Such Lands and that hereafter a good sure and indefeasible  
 Estate of Inheritance in fee simple any Law Statute usage or  
 Custom to the contrary notwithstanding. And be it further

Enacted That the said Comms<sup>rs</sup> and for their Charge and Trouble  
 in and about the Sales of the said Lands shall be allowed five pounds  
 by the hundred on the Money or Tobacco that shall arise on such  
 Sales to be by them deducted out of the said Money or Tobacco so  
 arising as aforesaid
