C H A P.
XXXIII.

II. Be it Enacted, by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary, by and with the Advice and Consent of his Lordship's Governor, and the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly, and the Authority of the same, That the Time in the said Act be lengthened, and that the said Jonas Green shall print the Laws of this Session within Four Months, and the Votes and Proceedings of the Lower House of Assembly this Session, within Five Months after the End thereof, and that on his Printing and Delivering the Laws, and Votes and Proceedings of this Session, within the Time herein limited, he shall be, and is hereby entitled to all the Benefits of the said Law, as if he had Printed them within the Time therein limited. Provided always, That nothing in this Act shall be construed to Repeal the aforesaid Act, except as to the Printing the Laws and Votes and Proceedings of this Session of Assembly only.

Time lengthened for Printing the Laws of this Session.

III. And the said Jonas Green, having due unto him, the Sum of Nine Pounds Twelve Shillings Current Money, for Two Record Books furnished by him, for the Use of the Public, Be it further Enacted by the Authority, Advice and Consent aforesaid, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore shall, out of the Public Money now in his Hands, pay to the said Jonas Green, or his Order, on Demand, the aforesaid Sum of Nine Pounds Twelve Shillings Current Money.
