of Tobacco, lately allotted and allowed to build and erect the Parish Church of the faid Chefter Parith, beyond what the faid Church will cost, and also CHAP. Sixteen Thousand Pounds of Tobacco, Part of the Savings aforefaid of the faid Parish for the present Year from the Thirty per Poll, by reason of the Vacancy of an Incumbent in the faid Parish, any Law, Statute, or Usage to the contrary, notwithstanding.

III. and whereas, by an Act of Assembly, entitled, An Act for erecting a new Parish in Kent County, called Chester Parish, and for building a Parish Church, and enlarging a Chapel of Ease within the Said new Parish, it was Enacted, That it should be lawful for the Justices of Kent County Court, to Assess and Levy on all the Taxable Inhabitants, of the said County, at November Court, Seventeen Hundred and Sixty-fix, such a Sum of Tobacco, as with the Balance then remaining in the Hands of the Vestry of St. Paul's Parish, unappropriated, which had then arisen on the Vacancy of an Incumbent in that Parish, would make One Hundred Thousand Pounds of Tobacco; and the further Sum of Eighty Thousand Pounds of Tobacco at the November Court next following, to the Use and Purpose of building a Church, and enlarging the Chapel in the said Chester Parish; and the Vestry of the said Chester Parish are by the said Act impowered to contract for the building the said Church, and enlarging the Chapel aforesaid: But, as the said Vestry of St. Paul's Parish, not being by the said Act expressly directed to pay the laid Balance remaining in their Hands, may doubt whether they are thereby sufficiently authorized and impowered to pay the same : Be it therefore hereby Enacted and Declared, That the said Vestry of St. Paul's Parish, of St. 'aui's, shall and may, and are hereby directed and required to render an Account to count to the faid Vestry of Chester Parish, of the Disposition of the Thirty per Poll of the said St. Paul's Parish, from the Death of the Reverend James Sterling, the late Incumbent, until November Court Seventeen Hundred and Sixty-five, and to pay the just Balance thereof now in their Hands, unto the said Vestry of Chester Parish, or to their Order, for the Use aforesaid: And, if any Part of the said Thirty per Poll, which arose due as aforesaid, shall not be now received by the said Vestry of St. Paul's Parish, of the Sheriff, or late Sheriff of Kent County, then the said Sheriff, and late Sheriff, are hereby directed and required to pay such Part of the said Thirty per Poll, as is now in their, or either of their Hands, to the said Vestry of Chester Parish, for the Use and Purpose aforesaid, and to render Account to them thereof; any Thing in any other Law, Usage, or Custom to the contrary, in any wife notwithstanding.

C H A P. XVI.

An ACT to impower the Justices of Somerset County to levy on the Taxable Inhabitants of Somerset Parish, in the said County, the Quantity of One Hundred and Forty-four Thousand Pounds of Tobacco, for the Uses therein mentioned.

Preamble.

HEREAS the Rector, Vestrymen, and sundry the Inhabitants of Somerset Parish, in Somerset County, have, by their humble Petition to this General Assembly, set forth, That the Chapel of Ease in the said Parish, called King's-Mill Chapel, is now much decay'd, and, in a little Time, will be dangerous for the Inhabitants to attend Divine Service therein; and that the same is too small for the Reception of the Congregation thereto adjacent, and not so well situated as might be; and also that Monie Church, in the said Parish, is too small for the Parishioners that attend at the same; and have humbly prayed that an Act may pass to enable the Rector, Vestrymen, and Churchwardens of the said Parish, to sell the Chapel aforesaid, and the Parcel of Land thereto belonging, and to purchase
