C H A P. XIX.

An ACT continuing an Act, entitled, An Act for Relieving the Inhabitants of this Province from Some Aggrievances in the Prosecution of Suits at Law, and for continuing the Supplementary Act thereto.

The it Enacted, by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary, by and with The Act of the Advice and Consent of his Lordship's Governor, and the Upper and 1714, cb. 4, Lower Houses of Assembly, and the Authority of the same, That an Act of Assembly of this Province, entitled, An Act for Relieving the Inhabitants of this Province from some Aggrievances in the Prosecution of Suits at Law, made at a Session of Assembly, begun and held at the City of Annapolis, the Twentysecond Day of June, Seventeen Hundred and Fourteen; also the Supplementary Act thereto, made at a Session of Assembly, begun and held at the City of Annapolis, the Third Day of October, Seventeen Hundred and Twenty-eight, And 1728, be, and are hereby continued, and shall remain and be in full Force, for the 24, conti-and during the Term of Seven Years, and to the End of the name of Seven Years, and during the Term of Seven Years, and to the End of the next Session of &c.

Affembly which shall happen after the End of the said Seven Years.

CHAP. XX.

An ACT to enable the Justices of Charles County Court to Affess and Levy on the Taxable Inhabitants of Trinity Parish, a Quantity of Tobacco for building a Chapel of Ease in Benedict Hundred, in said Parish, and for other Purposes therein mentioned.

THEREAS the Rector, Vestrymen, Churchwardens, and other Preamble. the Principal Inhabitants of Trinity Parish, and of Benedict Hundred, being Part of the said Parish, in Charles County, by their humble Petition to this General Assembly, have set forth, That the Church of the said Parish being very remote, and the Distance rendering it inconvenient for the Inhabitants of the said Hundred to attend Divine Worship; they therefore humbly Pray, that an Act may pass to enable the Justices of the said County, to levy on the Taxable Inhabitants of the faid Parish, the Sum of Fifty Thousand Pounds of Tobacco, clear of all Deductions, and Sheriff's Salary for Collection, to be levied at Three equal Assessments, in order to huild a Chapel of Ease on a rising Ground at the West Entrance into Villet's old Fields, near the Main Road that leadeth from Bryan-Town to Benedict, the said Situation being convenient not only for the Inhabitants of Benedict Hundred, but many others contiguous thereto, in the said Parish; which being by this present General Assembly thought reasonable:

II. Be it Enacted, by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary, by and with 50,000 ft of Tobacco to the Advice and Consent of his Lordship's Governor, and the Upper and Lower be levied in Houses of Assembly, and the Authority of the same, That the Justices of Charles Trinit, Parish, County Court, for the Time being, are hereby authorized and impowered to at 3 equal Af-Assessand Levy, (at November Court Seventeen Hundred and Sixty-seven, and so in November Court yearly, until the Year Seventeen Hundred and Sixty-nine, inclusive) at Three equal Assessments, on the Taxable Inhabitants of Trinity Parish, in the said County, a Quantity of Tobacco, not exceeding Fifty Thousand Pounds of Tobacco in the whole Three Assessments, together with the Sheriff's Salary of Five per Cent for Collection; which said Quantity of Fifty Thousand Pounds of Tobacco, shall be collected and levied by the Sheriff of the faid County, who is hereby authorized and directed to collect and levy the same, in the same Manner that other Parish Assessments are by Law directed to be levied and collected; and the said Tobac-
