

An ACT to encrease the allowance of justices of the peace,
and jurymen.

BE it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the end of this session of assembly, each justice attending the county or orphans court shall be allowed one hundred pounds of tobacco per day, for every day such justice shall attend the said courts respectively. Allowance to justices.

II. And be it enacted, That each jurymen attending the general court shall be allowed two hundred pounds of tobacco, for every day he shall attend, besides itinerant charges; and that each jurymen attending the county and orphans court shall be allowed seventy-five pounds of tobacco, for every day he shall attend the said courts respectively. To jurymen, &c.

III. This act to continue until the end of the next session of assembly. Continuance.

An ACT for the relief of certain collectors of the public assessment.

WHEREAS it has been represented to this general assembly, by the petitions of William Wright, of Queen-Anne's county, John Taylor, of Harford county, William Dawson, of Talbot county, Robertson Stevens, of Dorchester county, William Gillis, of Somerset county, Alexander Claggett, of Washington county, James Morfell, of Calvert county, Henry Stevenson, of Baltimore county, Benjamin Cawood, of Charles county, and John Burges, of Anne-Arundel county, that they could not complete their collection of the public assessment for the year seventeen hundred and seventy-nine, by reason of the inclemency of the weather; and the obstructions and difficulties they met with from it, and other matters, in the collection of the said public assessment: Preamble.

II. Be it therefore enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the said several collectors above mentioned be, and they are hereby, allowed until the first day of June next, to pay unto the treasurer of their respective shires the amount of the assessment and pound rate on all real and personal property within their counties, collected and levied, or to be collected and levied, in virtue of an act, entitled, An act to raise the supplies for the year seventeen hundred and seventy-nine, passed at a session of assembly begun and held at the city of Annapolis, on Monday the twenty-sixth day of October, in the year seventeen hundred and seventy-eight, and the several supplements thereto. Time for paying in assessment extended, &c.

III. And be it enacted, That the said several collectors be, and they are hereby indemnified and saved harmless from any penalties incurred by reason of their not having paid the amount of the assessment on the real Collectors indemnified, &c.
