

At a SESSION of the GENERAL ASSEMBLY
of MARYLAND, begun and held at the City of
ANNAPOLIS, on Monday the twelfth of June, in the year
of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty, the
following LAWS were enacted.

C H A P. I.

An ACT to authorise the commissioners appointed by the
act for the immediate supply of flour and other provisions
for the army, to hire or impress vessels and carriages.

BE it enacted, *by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the <sup>Power of com-
missioners con-
tinued, &c.</sup> power and authority of the commissioners appointed by the act,
entitled, An act for the immediate supply of flour and other
provisions for the army, and each of them, to hire or impress vessels
and carriages, for the purpose of transporting flour and other provisions
by them obtained, as given and provided by the said act, shall be and
is hereby revived and continued in full force until the end of the next
session of assembly; and in case of loss to the owner of any carriage or
vessel, the same shall be ascertained and paid for, as by the said act is
directed.

II. And, If any person appointed a commissioner under the said act
has departed this life,

III. Be it enacted, That either of the surviving commissioners in <sup>Surviving
commissioners
may take into
possession
flour, &c.</sup> the county may take into his possession any flour or other provisions
procured by such deceased commissioner, and cause the same to be con-
veyed in the manner directed by the said recited act.

C H A P. II.

An ACT to procure a loan.

BE it enacted, *by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the se- <sup>Names of per-
sons to receive
loans, &c.</sup> veral persons following shall be, and they are hereby authorised
and appointed to solicit and receive, on the behalf and credit of
this state, loans of paper money, crop tobacco, or gold and silver in
specie, from the inhabitants of their respective counties, and the city
of Annapolis and town of Baltimore, to wit: In Saint Mary's county,
Messieurs Jeremiah Jordan, John Debutts, Edmund Plowden, Tho-
mas Bond, Robert Armstrong, and William Kilgore. In Charles
county, Messieurs Daniel Jenifer, William Harrison, Gerard B.
Causin, Zephaniah Turner, and Francis Hammersley. In Prince-
George's county, Messieurs William Beanes, junior, Christopher
Lowndes, Thomas Clagett, Singleton Wootton, and Alexander How-
ard Magruder. In Baltimore county, Messieurs Andrew Buchanan,
Benjamin Rogers, Thomas Jones, John Moale, and George Lux. In
