## C H A P. VI.

An A C T for laying out a road from John Groff's mill in Frederick county.

Preamble.

**W** H E R E A S it is represented to this general assembly, by the petition of sundry inhabitants of Frederick county, that they labour under great inconveniences for want of a waggon road from John Groff's mill in Frederick county, until it intersects the main road leading from Marsh-creek to Baltimore-town in Baltimore county, at Michael Derr's farm, about one mile below Piney-creek, and also from the said mill, until it intersects the road at Joseph Myer's farm, about three miles below Pipe-creek: And it appearing reasonable to grant the said petition;

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That William Winchester, Thomas Durbin, and Michael M'Guire, or any two of them, are hereby authorized to lay out a waggon road, twenty feet wide, from the said John Groff's mill, until it intersects the main road aforesaid leading from Marsh-creek to Baltimore-town aforesaid, at Michael Derr's farm, one mile below Piney-creek; and also from the said mill, until it intersects the main road aforesaid, at Joseph Myer's farm, about three miles below Pipe-creek, in Frederick county aforesaid; which said road, when made, shall be a public road.

III. And be it enacted, That the commissioners aforesaid shall ascertain and value what damage such road running through any person's land as aforesaid shall amount to, which shall be paid to such person damaged as aforesaid by the said John Groff.

IV. And be it enacted, That said road shall not go through any orchard, garden, or meadow, unless with the approbation and consent of the owner.

## C H A P. VII.

An A C T to authorise and empower Frank Leeke, of Prince-George's county, to dispose of a tract of land called Wells's Invention, for the purpose therein mentioned.

Preamble.

**W** H E R E A S Frank Leeke, of Prince-George's county, hath by his petition to this general assembly set forth, that, according to the directions of an act, entitled, An act to empower Frank Leeke, of Prince-George's county, to settle and collect the debts due to Thomas Philpot, of London, merchant, and to apply the same, he hath settled his account against the said Thomas Philpot with the auditor-general and intendant, and entered into bond to the state, with sufficient security, conditioned for the faithful discharge of the trust reposed in him by the said act; that since the passing of the said
