VII. And be it enacted, That the chancellor, on proof to his satisfaction, that the said Elijah Merryman and David M<sup>c</sup>Mechen, or the survivor, or the said Mary Enfor, or any other person or persons who may hereafter be appointed by the chancellor, do not faithfully discharge the trust reposed in them respectively, or do not obey all orders which the chancellor shall make respecting the same, the chancellor may remove the person or persons so neglecting to execute the trust aforesaid, and appoint some other person in the place of the person removed; and such person so appointed shall have every power of a trustee, in as full and ample manner as if appointed by this act, first giving bond and security for the faithful execution of the trust aforesaid. VIII. And be it enacted, That the chancellor may allow unto the said Elijah Merryman and David M<sup>c</sup>Mechen, or the survivor, or any person or persons appointed trustee or trustees by the chancellor, such commission or satisfaction for the execution of the trust and powers committed to them, as he may think adequate to their trouble. C H A P. XIV.

An A C T for the sale of the glebe land in Shrewsbury parish in Kent county.

**W** H E R E A S the vestrymen and other the parishioners of Shrewsbury parish in Kent county, have by their humble petition to this general assembly set forth, that in the life time of the late reverend Mr. Forrester, there was a new parish laid out in the said county, which took in the glebe land belonging to the said parish, by which means the glebe now lies a considerable distance without the said parish, and they are of opinion it will be of much advantage to the parish to dispose of the said land, and to apply the money arising therefrom towards purchasing land more conveniently situated, or in case such cannot be immediately purchased, to put the money to interest, for the use of the said parish, until the present or some succeeding vestry have an opportunity of purchasing of land within the said parish conveniently situated for a glebe; the petitioners therefore pray, that a law may pass to enable them, or a succeeding vestry, to sell and convey the land now belonging to the said parish as a glebe; for the reasons aforesaid; which being thought reasonable: Preamble.

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the vestrymen and churchwardens of the parish of Shrewsbury, in Kent county, for the time being, or the major part of them, be and are hereby authorised and empowered to sell and convey, in fee simple; to the person that shall bid the best price, all the land belonging to the aforesaid parish as a glebe, at public vendue, after giving six weeks notice of the intended sale in the Maryland gazette and Baltimore journal, at the court-house door in Kent county, and at five of the most public places in the parish aforesaid, and the money arising from such sale to apply towards the purchasing of another piece of land lying within the Glebe to be  
sold, &c.
