

R E S O L U T I O N S .

RESOLVED, That William Kilty preface the second volume of his compilation of the laws of Maryland, by inserting the address of president George Washington to the people of the United States, bearing date the seventeenth day of September, seventeen hundred and ninety-six.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to George Chocke, of Harford county, or his order, the sum of two pounds four shillings and one penny current money, it being a balance due the said Chocke on the books of the treasury, with interest thereon from the twenty-first day of September, seventeen hundred and eighty-five.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Darby M'Namara, a poor and disabled foldier of the first Maryland regiment, the sum of twenty-five pounds six shillings and eleven-pence, with interest from the first of August, one thousand seven hundred and eighty, in consideration of a depreciation certificate for that amount heretofore issued to him and since lost.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to the examiner-general of the western shore such sum, in addition to his fees for the present year, as shall, in the whole, amount to the sum of £. 300; and the examiner-general shall lay before the next session of assembly the amount of fees by him received in this year, on oath.

Whereas the compensation allowed to the trustee under the act respecting the creditors and debtors of this state, passed at November session, seventeen hundred and ninety, after the first year, is inadequate to the services required of him, RESOLVED, That the said trustee shall be entitled to receive, as an additional compensation for his services for the present year, the sum of two hundred dollars.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore retain specie in the treasury to meet all appropriations that arose due on the first day of November last, the journal of accounts of the present session, and the civil list and annual expences of government, except the journal of accounts for eighteen hundred; and he is hereby directed to pay all money appropriations of this session, subject to the above appropriations.

RESOLVED, That the payment of the five months pay due the officers and foldiers, the sum due for services on board the barges, the redemption of the emissions of June, one thousand seven hundred and eighty, and the payment of certificates issued by this state, amounting in the whole to nine thousand two hundred and seventy-six pounds nine shillings and eleven-pence, be and the same are hereby suspended until the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and one; and the said sum shall be liable to the appropriations made for the present year.

RESOLVED, That the governor and council be and they are hereby authorized to employ some person or persons to stop the leak in the roof of the stadthouse, and to paint the external part, the expences attending the same to be paid out of the five hundred pounds subject to the appropriation of the governor and council.

RESOLVED, That James Calhoun, Nicholas Rogers, Jesse Hollingsworth, Elias Ellicott and James Carey, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to inquire into the situation of the prisoners confined in the gaol of Baltimore, the cloathing, feeding, management, and general superintendence of the said prisoners, and into any abuses which may have heretofore been committed in said gaol, and report fully to the criminal court of Baltimore county at their next sitting, and to the general assembly at their next session, the result of their inquiries as aforesaid.

RESOLVED, That the governor be requested to furnish the said James Calhoun, Nicholas Rogers, Jesse Hollingsworth, Elias Ellicott and James Carey, with a copy of the memorial of said prisoners, preferred to the present house of delegates.
