C H A P.
VIII.
Proceeds, how
to be applied,
&c.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the proceeds arising from the sale of said property shall be applied to the payment of the debts due and owing from the said William Thomas; the surplus, if any, shall be applied, under the direction of the orphans court of Kent county, for the use and benefit of the heirs of the said William Thomas.

Bond to be
given, &c.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the said Elizabeth Thomas, before she proceeds to make sale under the provisions of this act, shall execute a bond to the state of Maryland, in the penalty of ten thousand dollars current money of Maryland, for the use of the creditors of the said William Thomas, to be recorded in the office of Kent county court, for the faithful discharge of her duty under this act, and for the faithful application of the money arising from the said sale to the payment of the debts due from the said William Thomas.

R Davidson to
be exonerated,
&c.

V. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the said Elizabeth Thomas shall, and she is hereby authorised and empowered, upon the sale of the said grist and saw-mill, to exonerate and discharge the said Robert Davidson from any payment or responsibility from and under his bonds, passed to the said William Thomas for the payment of the purchase money of the said grist and saw-mill.

C H A P. IX.

An ACT authorising and directing the levy court of Somerset county to levy a sum of money for the support and maintenance of Levin Miles, a lunatic.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, by the petition of the trustees of the poor for Somerset county, that they have in their charge and keeping a certain Levin Miles, a lunatic, of turbulent disposition, praying that a sum of money may be levied on the assessable property of the said county for the safe keeping and support of the said Miles; therefore,

II. BE IT ENACTED, *by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the justices of the levy court for Somerset county shall, and they are hereby empowered, at their next meeting for the purpose of fixing the levy of said county, to levy such sum of money as will reimburse the said trustees for the expenses and charges which have accrued to them for providing for the said Miles since the first day of February last; and the said levy court shall and they are hereby directed to levy, at the same time, and annually thereafter, so long as the trustees aforesaid shall deem it necessary, such further sum, not exceeding one hundred and fifty dollars, which said sum, when so levied, shall be collected as other county levies are, and paid over to the said trustees, and applied by them in such manner as they may conceive will be most adviseable for the restoration and benefit of the said lunatic.

An ACT for the benefit of Edward Eversfield, a minor, and others, of Prince-George's county.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, by the memorial of Charles Eversfield, John Eversfield, Thomas Eversfield, Anne E. Eversfield, Eleanor Eversfield, Susannah F. Eversfield, Mary Eversfield and Elizabeth Eversfield, children and devisees of Matthew Eversfield, of Prince George's county, that it would conduce much to the interest and benefit of the memorialists, and particularly of their brother Edward Eversfield, who is a minor, that a law should pass this general assembly, authorising John Eversfield, the guardian of the said Edward Eversfield, to convey to his said sisters all his interest and estate in certain tracts of land in the said county for the consideration herein after mentioned; and the prayer of the said memorialists being deemed reasonable, therefore,

II. BE IT ENACTED, *by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That John Eversfield, guardian of Edward Eversfield, a minor, of Prince-George's county, be and he is hereby authorised and empowered to sell and convey unto Anne E. Eversfield, Eleanor Eversfield, Susannah F. Eversfield, Mary Eversfield and Elizabeth Eversfield, the maiden sisters of the said Edward Eversfield, all his right, title, interest and estate, in and to the following tracts or parcels of land in said county, to wit: Golden Race, Archer's Pasture, Gedling, Whimsacre, The Forest, The Farm, The Bite, Eversfield's Swamp, Quicksale and Taylorton, in consideration of the said sisters executing a full and absolute release of all claims against the said Edward Eversfield, arising out of that clause in the last will and testament of the said Matthew Eversfield, which enjoins the said Edward, in conjunc-
