to the order of this house. This house doth declare that the Errors  
assigned by Tho: Motley attorney of Capt Tho: Cornwallis are such  
that the Cause ought to be tryed again & therefore order that the  
whole Cause be tryed again at the Broo<sup>t</sup> Court sitting as a Court of  
Chancery on the 5<sup>th</sup> December next

The House adjourns till nine of the Clock to morrow Morning

Then went the Secretary to the Lower House with the act Entituled  
an Act for providing what shall be good Evidence  
Was taken into Consideration the petition of Tho: Taylor Culbert  
Henwick Wm Mills & John Bogue as Guardians to the Orphans of  
Henwick, and the House judged the act in that petition desired  
needless inasmuch as the will of Mr Wm Eltonhead is confirmed  
by the act for quietting professions

Then came an Act from the Lower House for the Repeal of the  
act Entituled an Act for killing wild Cattle which was assented unto

Then came an Act from the Lower House for unruly Servants

And the House Adjourned

And the House met again

Upon reading the Act prohibiting trading & Gaming with the servants  
the House ordered it to be Endorsed on the back thereof thus viz:

This Act is mistaken for this House never thought fit to allow  
that power to any one person to fine or set in pillory but that it ought  
to be done by the Provincial or some County Courts

Ordered that John Gillinge Clerk of this House engross all the Acts  
over so soon as possibly he can

The House adjourned till nine of the Clock to morrow Morning
