Sent to the House this following Message

By the honble Council June the 9th 1692

1st That Board pursuant to the Act for Payment of publick charge find
and vote to his Excellency the Governor of Gratuity which this
Board find very undoubtful for his Great Charges and trouble
and undertaking in the Seacable and happy Settlement of the
Government of this Province specially considering a larger Gratuity
to a Person of an inferior Capacity in the same Act allowed which
this Board desires may be rectified

2^d That Board finding that in the Acc^t of Mr^r Lynes for publick ex-
pences of this honble Council that each particular Article is charged
to their particular Acc^t for which Reason as it is informed to the Board
that an Act of your House Refers the said Lynes to them for
Satisfaction Notwithstanding by his Excellency's special Command
they came to attend him upon his arrival upon Surrender of the Govern-
ment and are recalled down upon Emergent Occasions which also this
Board desires may be rectified

3^d That Board likewise desire that some Consideration may be taken
in Relation to the last years Levy that your house would propose
some method of full Satisfaction of all Bells drawn by the several
Officers that are in the Country or others that may come in Protedu
on the same occasions and Shipping wherein if due care be not taken
it will destroy and render the Credit of the Country insignificant &
be very injurious to many good People living in and trading to
the same
