The president lays before the senate a petition from William Read, praying that a patent may be granted on a certain certificate, which was read, referred to the consideration of the house of delegates, and sent, with the above bills, the bill respecting finance, and the petition of Nicholas Carroll and James Carroll, by James M^rHenry, Esq;
