THE importance of the present crisis is so universally acknowledged, and our anxiety to place our country in a situation to repel danger, from whatever quarter it may arise, is so great, that we are induced, even at this late period of the session, to return you the bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to regulate and discipline the militia of this state, for your reconsideration.

Which said two bills next before mentioned, the bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the direction of sheriffs and coroners in the return of jurors, and for the better regulation of juries, with the amendments thereto, the bill, entitled, An act declaring what shall be evidence in certain cases therein mentioned, the bill, entitled, An act to alter the times of holding the county courts in Cæcil, Queen-Anne's and Talbot counties, the bill, entitled, An act to authorize and empower the levy court of Saint-Mary's county to assess and levy annually a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, and the resolution authorizing the governor and council to purchase two sets of Trumbull's prints, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
