On motion, ORDERED, That the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the methodist episcopal church in this state, the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the German lutheran society of the city of Baltimore, the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the presbyterian church of Pitt's creek hundred, in Worcester county, and the bill, entitled, An act for incorporating the methodist episcopal churches, known by the name of the Light-Street and Old-Town Methodist Churches, in the city of Baltimore, in the state of Maryland, be referred to Mr. Hollingsworth, Mr. Tyler, Mr. Worthington, Mr. Mackall and Mr. McCulloch, to consider and report such amendments to the same as they may think necessary.

The bill, entitled, An act for the valuation of real and personal property within this state, was sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. Tyler, from the committee, delivers to the president a bill, entitled, An act to alter and repeal such parts of the constitution and form of government of this state as relate to the division of Frederick county into election districts; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act to repeal the act to lay out several turnpike roads in Baltimore county, and for other purposes, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
