THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The resolution in favour of James Boarman was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money to finish the Baptist framed meeting-house in Baltimore county, the bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery for raising a sum of money to repair a church, and erect a parsonage-house, in Cæcil county, were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to lay out and streighten a certain road in Baltimore county, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. Strike out from the word "same" in the 11th line of the second page to the end of the clause, and insert "before he or they shall proceed to open the said road."

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of William M'Grigor, of Worcester county, and the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Eleanor Marshall, of Frederick county, were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
