F R I D A Y, November 22, 1805.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The resolution in favour of Frederick Green was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Benjamin Gushwa, Martin Rickart and John Manning, of Washington county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The senate proceeded, agreeably to order, to the second reading of the bill, entitled, An act to confirm an act, entitled, An act to provide for the trial of facts in the several counties of this state, and to alter, change and abolish, all such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the general court and courts of appeals; the bill being read throughout, the question was put, Shall this bill pass? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:

So it was resolved in the affirmative, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The president laid before the senate a communication from the executive, covering a letter from the secretary of war of the United States, requesting a return of the militia of this state by the first day of January next, or as soon thereafter as possible; which were read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act confirming the title of Ignatius Davis to the land therein mentioned, a bill, entitled, An act to open a road from Barnsville, in Montgomery county, to Zachariah Maccubbin's mill, and from thence to intersect the main road leading from Frederick-town to George-town, at or near Log-town, a bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Worcester county to levy annually a sum of money on the assessable property of said county for the purposes therein mentioned, severally passed by that house November 22, 1805; and the following resolution:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, November 22, 1805.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed to pay to Thomas Nicholls, of Simon, or his order, the sum of twenty-nine pounds five shillings current money, with interest thereon from the 12th day of July, 1797, being the actual expence incurred and paid by said Nicholls in surveying and ascertaining the quantity of land aforesaid.

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The following resolution being propounded to the senate, was read the first and second time by especial order and assented to.

RESOLVED, That the senate will proceed immediately to ballot for a director on the part of the state in the Bank of Baltimore, and that the person having a majority of all the votes of the attending members be declared duly elected.

The senate, pursuant to their resolution, proceeded to ballot for a director on the part of this state of the Bank of Baltimore; the ballots being deposited in the ballot box, on examination thereof it appeared, that John M'Kim, junior, was elected. Whereupon it is declared in the senate, that John M'Kim, junior, having had a majority of the votes of all the attending members, is elected by the senate, on the part of this state, a director of the Bank of Baltimore for and during the term prescribed by law.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act to change the names of Jacob Sedgwick, Matthias Sedgwick, George Sedgwick and Christian Sedgwick, to the names of Jacob Adreon, Matthias Adreon, George Adreon and Christian Adreon; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act authorising Lawrence Brengle, late collector of Frederick county, to complete his collection, was read the second time and will not pass.
