

VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, NOVEMBER SESSION, 1809. II

The bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Thomas Burk, and Elizabeth his wife, of Frederick county, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.  
The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of William Gibson, of Harford county, was read the second time and will pass.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

W E D N E S D A Y, November 22, 1809.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of William Gibson, of Harford county, was sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Lucas Shock, of Washington county, was read the second time by especial order, passed with the proposed amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendments proposed. 1. Strike out from the word "laws" in the 5th line of the 1st page to the word "of" in the same line of the same page. 2. Strike out from the word "shall" in the last line of the 1st page to the word "naturalize" in the same line of the same page and insert "within twelve months after he is capable of becoming a citizen." 3. Strike out from the word "laws" in the last line of the 1st page to the word "of" in the 1st line of the 2d page. 4. Strike out the word "decent" in the 3d line of the 2d page and insert "descent."

The bill, entitled, An act authorising the levy court of Washington county to open a road in said county, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled An act to confirm certain acts of justices of the peace who hold or have held offices under the general government, a bill, entitled, An act authorising Buckler Bond, of Harford county, to erect gates on the road therein mentioned, a bill, entitled, An act directing the register of the land office of the western shore to issue a patent to George Churchman, and others, for the land and lot therein mentioned, severally passed by that house November 21, 1809; a bill, entitled, An act for the support of Azariah, Philip and Ninian Riggs, of Anne-Arundel county, a bill, entitled, An act authorising the levy court of Montgomery county to levy a sum of money for the support and maintenance of David Hamilton, of Montgomery county, and a bill, entitled, An act for the support of Elizabeth Reid, of Montgomery county, severally passed by that house November 22, 1809; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the house of delegates returns the bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Amelia Peters, of Queen-Anne's county, with the following message:

By the HOUSE of DELEGATES, November 22, 1809.

*Gentlemen of the Senate,*

A Bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Amelia Peters, of Queen-Anne's county, as passed by this house, has been negatived by your body. It is one of those imperious cases to which we request the reconsideration of the senate.

The bill, entitled, An act to alter and change a part of a road in Anne-Arundel county, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. Strike out from the word "road" in the 8th line of the bill to the word "provided" in the 10th line of the bill and insert "leaves the old road, and following the track of the new road as now laid out and used until it intersects the old road."

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act making provision for the maintenance and education of Edward Spurrier, of Anne Arundel county, and Thomas Stone, of Charles county, son of General John Hoskins Stone, passed by that house November 22, 1809; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act to lay out and open a road from the lower end of William Darnes's lane, to intersect the public road leading from John Orme's plantation to Montgomery court-house at or near the Union Mills, was read the second time by especial order and will pass.
