BY THE SENATE, June 18, 1812.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We are ready to close the session, conformably with your message of this day, and have nominated Messrs. Nathaniel Williams and M^cCreery, to join the gentlemen named by you, a committee to wait on the governor, and request his attendance in the senate chamber to sign and seal the engrossed bills, according to the constitution of this state.

Which was read.

The engrossed bills Nos. 9 and 10 were read, assented to, and sent to the senate. The clerk of the senate returns the said bills, severally endorsed, "read and assented to."

Also, the engrossed bills Nos. 6, 7 and 8, severally endorsed, "read and assented to;" which were severally read, assented to, and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the resolution relative to the printer to the state, endorsed, "assented to"

Messrs. Brown and Davis, from the senate, inform the speaker that the governor is attending in the senate to sign and seal the engrossed bills, and request his, and the attendance of this house for that purpose.

On motion by Mr. Stevens, ordered, that when this house do adjourn, it stand adjourned to the first Monday in October next.

The speaker left the chair, and attended by the members of this house, went to the senate, and there presented the following engrossed bills to the governor, who signed the same, and affixed the great seal thereto in the presence of both houses :

Nos. 1. An act authorising the several banks in this state to loan money to the United States.

2. A supplement to an act entitled, An act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of The Cumberland Bank of Allegany.

3. A supplement to the act entitled, An act to incorporate a bank to be called, The Farmers' Bank of Somerset and Worcester.

4. An act authorising an appropriation for the penitentiary of this state.

5. An act to authorise the governor, in certain cases, to arm the militia of this state.

6. A supplement to the act entitled, An act for the relief of Joseph Ennalls, of Dorchester county.
