

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Dec. 26, 1812.

*Gentlemen of the Senate,*

We have reconsidered the bill entitled, an act for the valuation of real and personal property in the several counties of this state, and have agreed to recede from the 5th, 6th and 9th amendments. To all the other amendments we have adhered. We have also added three other amendments. We hope that the bill, as now amended, will receive your concurrence.

Mr. Plater delivers a bill entitled, an act for the removal of certain proceedings against general Henry Lee, of the city of Alexandria, from the county court of Baltimore county to the county court of Montgomery county, and for other purposes; which was read.

Mr. Randall delivers a bill entitled, an act to lay out a road in Baltimore county; which was read the first and second time by special order and passed.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Debby Ann M'Coy, an infant, of Anne Arundel county, was read the second time by special order and passed.

On motion by Mr. Bowles, the following resolution was read:

*Resolved,* That the executive be requested to have printed, on the most reasonable terms, all the testimony taken before the committee of grievances and courts of justice, relative to the late mobs and riots in the city of Baltimore, and cause one copy to be forwarded to each member of the general assembly; and they are hereby authorised to draw an order on the treasurer of the Western Shore for the amount of the expense of said printing.

The house adjourns until Monday morning 9 o'clock.

MONDAY, December 28, 1812.

THE House met.—Present the same members as on Saturday except Messrs. Banning, Frey, Potter and M'Donald.—The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The amendments proposed by the Senate to the bill entitled, a further additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to provide for the organization and regulation of the courts of common law in this state and for the administration of justice therein, were read the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The speaker laid before the house a report of the clerk of Calvert county court, relative to the attendance of the judges of said court; which was read and referred to the committee of grievances and courts of justice.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower Baruch Fowler, of Anne Arundel county to convey and to receive a conveyance of certain lands therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Debby Ann M'Coy, an infant of Anne Arundel county; the bill entitled, an act to lay out a road in Baltimore county; the bill entitled, an act to establish a Bank in the city of Baltimore, to be called the City Bank of Baltimore; the resolution in favor of Samuel Moale; the resolution relative to an order of the Court of Appeals for the Eastern Shore; the resolution relative to Chancellor Kilty's report of British Statutes; the resolution in favor of Sedgwick James of Harford county; the bill for the valuation of real and personal property in the several counties of this state, with the message relative thereto, were sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the resolution in favor of the Rev. Joseph Wyatt, and the resolution in favor of James Hood (of John) severally endorsed, assented to. The bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company for the purpose of building a bridge over the river Susquehanna, at or near Rock Run; the bill entitled, an act to lay out and open a road in Baltimore county; the bill entitled, a supplement to revive, amend and continue an act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the line of the district of Columbia, where it crosses the post road leading from George town to Frederick town, through Montgomery and Frederick counties to Frederick town; the bill entitled, an act for the support of William M. Chaney of Anne Arundel county; the bill entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, an act to change the name of George town cross roads in Kent county; the bill entitled, an act to encourage the education of youth in Worcester county; the bill entitled, an act to establish and confirm the Fall's turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to Richard Caton's Lime Kiln; the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Alice Craycroft; the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company for erecting a bridge over great Choptank river, at or near Dover Ferry; the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Matilda Turner of the city of Baltimore; the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Moses Grier of Worcester county; the bill entitled, an act to authorise the levy court of Baltimore county to assess & levy on the assessable property of said county, a sum of money to build a bridge over the White Marsh run, in Baltimore county, on the road leading from Belle Air to the city of Baltimore; the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the Presbyterian congregation of Queen Ann's and Caroline counties; the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Margaret Lamb of the city of Annapolis; the bill entitled, an act authorising an appropriation for the penitentiary of this state, and the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Samuel W. Beck of Prince George's county, severally endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. The bill entitled, an act for draining a branch or swamp called Bee tree swamp lying in Caroline county, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read. The bill entitled, an act to alter change and abolish all such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the time and manner of electing the senate of this state, and manner of filling up vacancies in that body; the bill entitled, an act to ascertain the allowance of jurors in certain cases. The bill entitled, an act directing the clerks of county courts, and the sheriffs of the several counties of this state to transmit annually to the clerk of the house of delegates a statement of all the public monies paid by them to the treasurers of their respective shores; the bill entitled,
