

The clerk of the senate delivers the resolution in favor of the Examiner General, endorsed, "assented to." The resolution relative to an order of the Court of Appeals for the Eastern Shore, endorsed, "dissented from." The bill entitled, an act for the relief of James Patton, of Talbot county, endorsed, "will not pass," and the bill entitled, an act to lay out and open a road in Anne Arundel county. The bill entitled, an act annulling the marriage of Vincent P. Taylor, and Elizabeth his wife; the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Andrew Porter Evans, a purchaser of confiscated property; the bill entitled, an act respecting certain land certificates in Washington county; the bill entitled, an act to stop a public road in Prince George's county; the bill entitled, an act for the relief of George Michael Conradt, of Frederick county; the bill entitled, a supplement to an act passed at November session, seventeen hundred and ninety six, entitled, an act respecting the roads in Somerset and Worcester counties; the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act authorising the levy court of Prince George's county, to open a road in said county; the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Elizabeth Peters of Prince George's county; the bill entitled, an act to make public a road in Queen Ann's county, and the bill entitled, an act to sell part of the real estate of Nicholas Carroll, late of the city of Annapolis, deceased, severally endorsed "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. Also the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to extend M'Elderry street, in the Eastern precincts of Baltimore; the bill entitled, an act to make public an old road leading from South River Church to intersect the Annapolis Road to West River; and the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Debby Ann M'Coy, an infant of Anne Arundel county, severally endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of James Gouty, Mary Gouty, Lucretia Gouty and John Stevens Gouty, late of Caroline county deceased; and the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Charles Thompson, of Dorchester county, severally endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read, assented to, and the bills ordered to be engrossed. Also a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for extending and uniting Holliday street, in the city of Baltimore, passed by the senate December 29th; Which was read.

The house resumed the consideration of the report of the committee of grievances and courts of justice, relative to the late mobs and riots in the city of Baltimore, and after some time spent in reading the depositions taken before the committee the house adjourned until this evening at five o'clock.

The bill entitled, an act to lay out a road in Baltimore county, and the bill entitled, an act to alter change and repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government of this state, as relate to the division of Prince George's county, into election districts, severally endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. And the bill entitled, an act to authorise William Courts, of Charles county, to remove and bring into this state certain negroes; and the bill entitled, an act to establish a bank in the city of Baltimore, to be called the City Bank of Baltimore, severally endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read.

The house resumed the consideration of the report of the committee of grievances and courts of justice, and after some time spent therein, the house adjourned until to-morrow morning nine o'clock.

THE house met.—Present the same members as on yesterday.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Randall delivers a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate certain persons in every christian church or congregation of this state; which was read.

Mr. Lecompte delivers a petition from the managers of the Washington Free School, in the city of Baltimore, praying a lottery to defray the expence of building a school house; which was read and referred to Messrs Lecompte, Kilgour and J. Stewart.

Mr. M'Culloh from the committee delivers the following report:

The committee to whom was referred the petition of Thomas Clinton, late five major in the fourth Maryland regiment, report, that they have taken the same into consideration, and find the facts therein stated to be true; they therefore recommend the following resolution:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore, be and he is hereby authorised and directed to pay to the said Thomas Clinton, annually, during his life, or to his order, in quarterly payments, such sum of money equal to the half pay of a five major, as a further remuneration for those services rendered his country during the American war.
