The clerk of the senate delivers the following message :

BY THE SENATE, Dec. 30, 1812.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received your message accompanying the bill entitled, an act for the valuation of real and personal property in the several counties of this state, and have receded from our disagreement to the 3rd, 4th, 7th, 8th, 10th, and 11th amendments, and assented to them. The additional amendments to the bill proposed by your house, cannot receive our concurrence, because the senate conceives that the house of delegates cannot, consistently with parliamentary usage, and the long established practice of the legislature, recede from, or insist on its own amendment, with an amendment, or amend its own amendment.

Which was read.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, *Ordered*, that the bill entitled, an act to provide for the administration of justice in cases of crimes and misdemeanors in the city and county of Baltimore, be made the order of the day for to-morrow :

Mr. Lecompte delivers a bill entitled, an act to authorise a lottery for the use and benefit of the Washington Free School in the city of Baltimore ; which was read.

The house proceeded to the consideration of the amendments proposed by the senate to a bill entitled, an act to establish a bank in the city of Baltimore, to be called the city Bank of Baltimore, and the question was put, that the house assent to the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th amendments ? Resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put, that the house assent to the sixth amendment, as follows : 6. " Strike out from the word " state" in the 8th line of the 39th page, to the word " and" in the 4th line of the 42nd page, and insert, " *And be it enacted*, that if the several banks in this state shall, on or before the first day of October next, agree to the terms proposed to them in the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road leading to Cumberland, and for the extension of the charters of the several banks in this state, and for other purposes ; and elect and bind themselves, to pay into the treasury twenty thousand dollars annually as therein required, and the banks in the city of Baltimore and Washington county, shall bind themselves as therein required to make said turnpike road, then shall the bank herein incorporated, be considered one of the banks in the city of Baltimore within the meaning of said act, and shall be bound to bear its part of the payment of said twenty thousand dollars annually, into the treasury, and of making said road according to the terms prescribed in said act, and the faith of the state is hereby pledged not to impose any other or further tax or bonus or imposition of any nature or kind on said bank during the continuance of the charter." Determined in the negative.

The question was then put, that the house assent to the 7th amendment ? Resolved in the affirmative.

The house adjourns until this evening 5 o'clock.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Henry King, and the bill entitled, an act for the removal of certain proceedings against General Henry Lee, of the city of Alexandria, from the county court of Baltimore county, to the county court of Montgomery county, and for other purposes, were severally read the second time and passed.

The bill entitled, an act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money to purchase a fire engine in Cumberland in Allegany county ; the bill entitled a supplement to the act entitled, an act for extending and uniting Holliday-street in the city of Baltimore ; and the bill entitled, an act to authorise a lottery for the use and benefit of the Washington Free School in the city of Baltimore, were read the second time by special order and passed.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of John W. Hackett, of Queen Ann's county, was read the second time, and on motion br Mr. Stevens, the question was put, that the same be referred to the consideration of the next general assembly ? Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate certain persons in every christian church or congregation in this state, was read the second time, and on motion by Mr. Young, the question was put, that the same be referred until the first day of June next ? Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Young, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act for the payment of the journal of accounts. *Ordered*, that the committee of claims prepare and bring in the same.
