

Baltimore, for the eastern district in the city of Baltimore, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

*Amendment proposed.*

Strike out from the word "mentioned" in the 15th line of the 3d page to the word "be" in the last line of the same page.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Nancy Rouse of Caroline county; a bill entitled, an act for the relief and benefit of Sarah Stinchcomb; a bill entitled, an act to authorise and direct the sheriff of Montgomery county to execute a deed or deeds therein mentioned; a bill entitled, an act to lay out and open a road in Talbot county; a bill entitled, an act to ratify the title of Henry Banning and Anthony Banning in and to certain lots of land in the town of Oxford; a bill entitled, an act to authorise the levy court of Baltimore county to assess and levy on the assessable property of said county a sum of money to build a bridge over the White Marsh Run, in Baltimore county, on the road leading from Belle Air to the city of Baltimore; a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of John Sample of York county, Pennsylvania; a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Samuel W. Beck of Prince George's county; a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Franklin Lee Ridgely and Richard Greenbury Ridgely, minors; a bill entitled, an act authorising Richard Ruff of Harford county to make sale of the land therein mentioned, severally passed by that house Dec. 18, 1812; and the following resolution:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Dec. 18, 1812.

*Resolved*, That the levy court of Baltimore county or a majority of them be, and they are hereby authorised to view the land in the neighborhood of and lying and being between Deep Bottom and Thomas Owing's Mill, as also between Thomas Owings Mill and the Reister's town turnpike road, and that they report to the next general assembly, whether a road commencing at Deep Bottom aforesaid and thence running by Thomas Owing's Mill to the said Reister's town turnpike road is necessary, and would be conducive to the public convenience, and if the said levy court or a majority of them shall be of opinion that it would be proper to open a road, that then they make a location of the same and return it with their proceedings to the general assembly aforesaid.

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The resolution in favor of the representatives of John and Samuel Snowden, was read the second time, dissented from, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Samuel Kerr of Kent county; the bill entitled, an act providing for the appointment of Bailiffs for the city of Baltimore, and the bill entitled, an act directing the manner in which justices of the peace shall qualify and for other purposes, were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act annulling the marriage of John Keyser and Catherine Keyser his wife of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time and will not pass.

The senate adjourns until to morrow morning nine o'clock.

SATURDAY, December 19, 1812.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Bruce & Mr. L. Hollingsworth. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Frazier appeared in the senate.

The bill entitled, an act for opening and extending Low street in the eastern precincts of Baltimore, was sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

A petition from James Fennell, praying a special act of insolvency, was preferred, read and referred to Mr. N. Williams, MacCreery and Mr. Davis to consider and report thereon.

On motion, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to grant a public road and confirm the same in the upper part of Queen Ann's county.

*Ordered*, that Mr. Brown, Mr. Holbrook and Mr. Davis be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. N. Williams from the committee to whom was referred the petition of James Fennell, delivers a bill entitled, an act for the relief of James Fennell; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, *Ordered*, that the bill entitled, an act for the relief of William Smith and others of the city of Baltimore, have a second reading on Wednesday next the 23d inst.

Mr. Brown from the committee delivers a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to grant a public road and confirm the same in the upper part of Queen Ann's county; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act to lay out and make public a road in Kent county; a bill entitled, an act to alter, change and abolish all such parts of the constitution and form of government which relate to the time and manner of electing the senate of this state, and the manner of filling up vacancies in that body, severally passed by that house Dec. 19th 1812; And the following resolution:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Dec. 18, 1812.

*Resolved*, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed to pay to John Burns, late a soldier in the revolutionary war, or to his order, during life, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private.
