BY THE SENATE, Dec. 30, 1812.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received your message accompanying the bill entitled, an act for the valuation of real and personal property in the several counties of this state, and have receded from our disagreement to the 4th, 8th, 10th and 11th amendments, and assented to them. The additional amendments to the bill proposed by your house cannot receive our concurrence, because the senate conceives that the house of delegates cannot consistently with parliamentary usage, and the long established practice of this legislature, recede from or insist on its own amendment, with an amendment, or amend its own amendment.

The resolution in favor of Sedgwick James, of Harford county, and the resolution relative to the Treasurer of the Eastern Shore, were severally read the second time, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk. On motion, the question was put, will the senate reconsider the bill entitled, an act for the relief of the heirs of John Chaires? Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill being read, the question was put, shall this bill pass? Determined in the negative.

The resolution relative to certain officers of the navy of the United States, and the resolution in favor of Nicholas Milburn, William Bruce and Thomas S. Brewer, were severally read the second time and assented to.

The resolution in favor of Benjamin M'Nesh, was read the second time and dissented from.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

THURSDAY, December 31, 1812.

The senate met.—Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. W. Hollingsworth.—The proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr. Thomas, (President,) appeared in the senate.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of the heirs of John Chaires; the resolution relative to certain officers of the navy of the United States, and the resolutions in favor of Nicholas Milburn, William Bruce, Thomas S. Brewer and Benjamin M'Nesh, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a further supplement to an act to enlarge the powers of the commissioners of the town of Havre-de-Grace. Ordered, that Messrs MacCreery, N. Williams and L. Hollingsworth, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. MacCreery from the committee delivers a bill entitled, a further supplement to an act to enlarge the powers of the commissioners of the town of Havre de Grace; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act authorising Robert Welsh, (of Ben.) former collector of Anne Arundel county to complete his collection; a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Henry King; a bill entitled, an act to authorise a lottery for the use and benefit of the Washington Free School in the city of Baltimore; a bill entitled, an act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money to purchase a fire engine, in Cumberland, in Allegany county; a bill entitled, an act for the removal of certain proceedings against General Henry Lee, of the city of Alexandria, from the county court of Baltimore county to the county court of Montgomery county, and for other purposes, severally passed by that house, Dec. 30, 1812; and the following resolutions:
