On motion, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to establish a bank in the city of Baltimore, to be called the City Bank of Baltimore.

Ordered, that Mr. L. Hollingsworth, Mr. MacCreery and Mr. N. Williams be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The following message was read, agreed to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk:

BY THE SENATE, May 20, 1813.

*Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,*

We are ready to proceed immediately to the election of a senator, to represent this state in the senate of the United States. We have appointed Mr. Brown and Mr. Davis to join the gentlemen named by your house. No person is put in nomination by the senate in addition to the gentlemen named in your message.

Mr. Lloyd from the committee, to whom was referred the resolution relative to a deputation to the general government, reported the same with the following amendment:

Strike out from the word "what" in the fifth line, to the end of the resolution, and insert "further protection will be afforded by the general government against the incursions of the common enemy, and also what provision may be expected to liquidate the necessary expenditures which have been incurred in providing against their aggressions." Which was read.

Mr. N. Williams from the committee delivers a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act authorising James Sloan, Senior, of the city of Baltimore, as attorney for Dr. Joseph Mackrill, to execute a deed to Edward Harris for the lands therein mentioned; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of Delegates by the clerk.

The senate proceeded to the election of a senator to represent this state, in the senate of the United States; the ballot box being prepared, the ballots were deposited therein, sealed up and delivered to the committee of the senate, appointed to meet the committee of the house of delegates, who went to the conference room and after some time, returned and reported that Robert H. Goldsborough had fifty three votes, and Edward Lloyd thirty five votes. Whereupon it is declared in the senate, that Robert H. Goldsborough having had a majority of votes, is duly elected a senator to represent this state in the senate of the United States.

The clerk of the house of delegates returns the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act for opening and extending Aisquith street, in the eastern precincts of Baltimore, passed by that house May 20, 1813. Ordered to be engrossed.

The resolution relative to a deputation to the general government, was read the second time by special order, assented to with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Peter a Carns of St. Mary's county, passed by that house May 20, 1813; which was read the first and second time by special order, and will pass with the proposed amendment:

*Amendment proposed.*

Strike out from the word "that" in the 3d line to the end of the bill and insert, "Peter a Carns of St. Mary's county shall be, and he is hereby entitled to receive the benefit of the act entitled, an act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, and the several supplements thereto, according to the terms and conditions prescribed in the said acts, without being obliged to furnish evidence that he has resided two years within the state of Maryland."

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock,

FRIDAY, May 21, 1813.

The senate met.—Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. L. Hollingsworth and Mr. Lloyd.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to regulate and discipline the militia of this state.

Ordered, that Mr. N. Williams, Mr. Bruce and Mr. Brown be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion, the question was put, will the senate reconsider the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Peter A. Carns of St. Mary's county? Resolved in the affirmative. On progression in reading the question was put, will the senate recede from their amendment? Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill being read the question was put, shall this bill pass? Resolved in the affirmative, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

A petition from Gerard Topken of Baltimore county, praying a special act of insolvency, was presented, read and referred to Mr. Davis, Mr. Brown and Mr. Hawkins, to consider and report thereon.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act authorising Elizabeth Luckett of Frederick county to remove certain negroes into the state of Maryland, passed at November session eighteen hundred and eleven, passed by that house May 20th, 1813, and a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to encourage the education of youth in Worcester county, passed by that house May 21st, 1813; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Davis from the committee, to whom was referred the petition of Gerard Topken, delivers a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Gerard Topken, an insolvent debtor of the city of Baltimore; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The president laid before the senate a letter from John Brewer, praying compensation for the services performed by him as register of the land office for the Western Shore, under the assessment law of the last session. And also that the bond given by him to the treasurer, as agent for the sale of Chancellor Kilty's report of British Statutes, which he states that he has been unable to dispose of, may be cancelled; which was read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.
