Mr. John H. Thomas delivers a bill entitled, an act to extend the powers of the orphans courts of the several counties of this state in certain cases; which was read.

Mr. Robert Evans delivers a bill entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to lay out and make public a road therein mentioned in Cecil county, passed the 6th January, 1810; which was read.

THE House met.—Present the same members as on yesterday.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The speaker laid before the house a report of the clerk of Cecil county court, relative to the attendance of the judges; which was read and referred to the committee of grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Belt delivers a petition from John Carman, of Anne Arundel county, praying that the levy court may be authorised to levy a sum of money for his support; which was read and referred to Messrs. Belt, Wm. Hall and Dorsey.

Mr. Ma on delivers a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for founding an academy at Hagar's town, in Washington county; which was read.

Mr. Long delivers a petition from Thomas Robertson, of Somerset county, praying a divorce; which was read and referred to Messrs. Long, Bayly and Parnham.

Mr. F. M. Hall delivers a bill entitled, an act authorising Wm. G. D. Worthington to sell the real estate of Thomas Contee, late of Prince George's county, deceased; which was read.

Mr. Williams delivers a petition from Elizabeth Christopher, of Worcester county, praying that the levy court may be authorised to levy a sum of money for her support; which was read and referred to Messrs. Williams, Wilson and Handy.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate a school in Worcester county, was read the second time and passed.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Henry W. Magruder, of Prince George's county, was read the second time and passed.

Mr. Belt delivers a bill entitled, an act to authorize and empower the levy court of Anne Arundel county to assess and levy a sum of money for the support and maintenance of Margaret Miller and her four children; which was read the first and second time by special order, and passed.

Mr. Quinton delivers a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Chas. Dashiell (of Ch.) of Worcester county; and Mr. John H. Thomas a bill entitled, an act for the relief of John Westfall, of Frederick county; which were severally read the first and second time by special order and passed.

Mr. Crabb delivers a petition from Elizabeth Crabb, of Montgomery county, praying that a law may pass authorising the sale of certain lands belonging to her infant daughters; which was read and referred to Messrs. Crabb, John H. Thomas and Jones.

Mr. John H. Thomas delivers a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Margaret Griffith, of Frederick town, in Frederick county; which was read the first and second time by special order and passed.

Mr. Harryman delivers a bill entitled a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to lay out a road from Wm. Sinclair's plantation to Vaughan's mine run and Gunpowder mill, and from thence to the Owl Branch, passed at November session 1812; which was read the first and second time by special order and passed.

Mr. Quinton delivers a bill entitled, an act to encourage the destruction of squirrels in Worcester county; which was read the first and second time by special order, and on motion by Mr. Bayly the question was put that the further consideration of the same be referred to the first day of October next? Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Stonestreet delivers a bill entitled, an act authorising persons to whom letters testamentary or of administration have been or may be granted in the District of Columbia to prosecute and recover claims in this state; which was read.

Mr. Forwood (of Wm.) delivers a bill entitled, a supplement to an act to make public an old road in Harford county; which was read.

The bill entitled, an act to alter, straighten and amend the road therein mentioned in Harford county, was read the second time by special order and passed.

Mr. Tilghman delivers a bill entitled, an act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of the Conocoche gue Bank, in Williamsport, in Washington county; which was read.
