

NEGATIVE.

Messrs. Dorsey, Sellman, Belt, Wm. Hall, Bennett, S. Stevens, Claude, Duvall, Wright, Forwood, (of Wm.) Culbreth, Willis, Barney, Donaldson, Tilghman, Mason, Gabby, Saulsbury—18.

So it was resolved in the affirmative.

The house resumed the consideration of the bill entitled, an act authorising persons to whom letters testamentary or of administration, have been or may be granted in any of the United States, the District of Columbia, or any of the territories belonging to the United States, to prosecute and recover claims in this state, and on motion by Mr. Dorsey the question was put, that the said bill be referred to the first day of June next? Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a petition from David Stirrat, of the city of Baltimore, praying a special act of insolvency; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Barney and Warner.

Mr. Hands delivers a petition from Sarah Morgan, of Kent county, stating that her husband died in consequence of exposure to the inclemency of the weather, while serving in the militia, during the last summer, and praying pecuniary aid from the state; which was read and referred to Messrs. Hands, Brown and Boyer,

Mr. Donaldson delivers a memorial from Hezekiah Niles, of the city of Baltimore, stating that he is about to publish a corrected copy of the Constitution of Maryland, and proposing that the state shall purchase a number of copies to be distributed with the laws of the present session? which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Bayly and Mason.

On motion by Mr. Culbreth, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for amending and reducing into system the laws and regulations concerning last wills and testaments, the duties of executors, administrators and guardians, and the rights of orphans, and other representatives of deceased persons; Ordered, That Messrs. Culbreth, Bennett and Mason be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Wilson delivers a bill entitled, an act authorising a partition of the lands therein mentioned; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Warner delivers a petition from the managers of the Baltimore General Dispensary, praying that they may be authorised to raise by way of lottery, a sum of money to be vested in stock, as a permanent fund for the use of the Dispensary; which was read and referred to Messrs. Warner, Donaldson and Randall

On motion by Mr. Bayly, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to lay out and make public a road in Somerset county, passed in November session 1812. Ordered, That Messrs. Bayly, Long and Waller be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Randall, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled an act to confirm a road in Harford and Baltimore counties. Ordered, That Messrs. Randall, Forwood, (of Wm.) and Donaldson be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the children of Henry Miles, of Somerset county, endorsed "will not pass." The bill entitled, an act to authorise Gustavus R. A. Brown, and Caroline his wife of Prince William county, in the state of Virginia, to convey certain property in the precincts of Baltimore city, in Baltimore county; the bill for the relief of Nelly White, of Worcester county; and the bill for the relief of Ann and Mary Cheswich, daughters of Ann Strong, of Saint Mary's county, severally endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. Also the bill entitled, an act to authorise William Vincent, of Charles county, to remove and bring into this state certain negroes; and the bill entitled, an act to lay out and make public a road therein mentioned in Cecil county, severally endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read, assented to and the bills ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. Bayly delivers a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to lay out and make public a road in Somerset county, passed in November session eighteen hundred and twelve; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

The bill entitled, an act to alter and change the place of holding the elections in the first election district in Kent county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The resolution in favor of Richard Taylor, was sent to the senate; the bill entitled an act to annul the marriage of Everett Wroe, and Mary Wroe his wife, was read the second time and passed.

On motion by Mr. John H. Thomas, Ordered, That the bill for the extension of Franklin street in the western precincts of the city of Baltimore, be made the order of the day for Wednesday next, and that Hezekiah Clagett a petitioner against the passage of the said bill, and the petitioners in favor thereof may then be heard by counsel at the bar of the house.

Mr. Randall delivers a bill entitled, an act authorising the sale of the real estate of Ruth Howard deceased, wife of Thomas M. Howard, and for other purposes, and a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to confirm a road in Harford and Baltimore counties; and Mr. Duvall a bill entitled, an act to enable the president directors and company of the Farmers' Bank of Maryland at Annapolis, and of the branch bank at Easton, to remove said banks in case of necessity, and for other purposes; which were severally read.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey the question was put, that the house reconsider the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Levin Kimmey, of Caroline county? Resolved in the affirmative. The question was then put, shall the said bill pass? Resolved in the affirmative.

The amendments proposed by the senate to the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Richard Newman, of Kent county, were read the second time, assented to and the bill ordered to be engrossed.
