

tain road in Baltimore county; the bill entitled, an act to lay out and make public a road in Cecil county; the bill entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, an act to open and extend Pratt street in the city of Baltimore, passed at November session 1811, and the supplement thereto; the bill entitled, an act laying a tax on all lotteries which may be hereafter authorised by the laws of this state; the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Charles Harstons, of Baltimore county; the bill entitled, an act to enable the president and directors of the Farmer's Bank of Maryland at Annapolis, and of the Branch Bank at Easton, to remove said banks in case of necessity, and for other purposes; the bill for the relief of Mary Ann, Frances and Eliza Johnson; and the engrossed bills No. 51 to 65 inclusive and No. 66 to 80 inclusive, were sent to the senate.

The bill entitled, an act authorising Matthias Dashiell, former sheriff and collector of Somerset county, to complete his collections, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Anne Mackie, which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise the sale of certain real estate held by Joseph P. M'Kean, in trust for the children of Andrew Buchanan, deceased, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The bill for the relief of John Devereux, late of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Parnham delivers a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to open the navigation of Zachia Run; and Mr. Duvall a bill entitled, an act authorising Robert Welch (of Ben.) collector of Anne Arundel county, to complete his collection; which were severally read.

The clerk of the senate delivers a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the speedy recovery of small debts out of court, and to repeal the act of assembly therein mentioned; the bill entitled, an act to make public an old road in Harford county; and the bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act entitled, an act to regulate the inspection of tobacco; severally endorsed "will not pass." The bill entitled, an act for the preservation of young Shad Fish in the river Susquehanna, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read. The bill entitled, an act authorising Richard Lawrence, of Baltimore county, to remove a certain negro from the state of Delaware into this state; and the bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower the levy court of Caroline county, to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, severally endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read, assented to and the bills ordered to be engrossed.

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to revive an act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the town of Westminster, in Frederick county, through Harman's Gap to Hager's town, in Washington county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The bill entitled, an act authorising Edward Wilkins, late sheriff and collector of Kent county, to complete his collections; the bill entitled, an act to make public a road in Somerset county; the bill entitled, an act authorising Thomas Saulsbury, late sheriff and collector of Caroline county, to complete his collections; and the bill entitled, an act to authorise the raising a sum of money, by a lottery or lotteries to build an arsenal for the city of Baltimore, were severally read the second time and passed.

The bill from the senate entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate certain persons in every christian church or congregation in this state, passed November session 1802; was read the second time, and the question put, shall the said bill pass? Determined in the negative.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a petition from the Faculty of Physic, of the University of Maryland, praying a lottery for the benefit of their faculty; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Barney and Dorsey.

Mr. Duvall delivers a petition from Archibald Golder, and Westley Hyatt, counter to the petition of Alexis Romain, of the city of Baltimore; which was read and referred to the committee on the petition to which it is counter.

Mr. Blake delivers a petition from Wm. R. Sewall, of Calvert county, praying a special act of insolvency; which was read and referred to Messrs. Blake, Turner and Reynolds.

Mr. Reynolds delivers a petition from Benjamin Leitch, former collector of Calvert county, praying that he may be authorised to complete his collections; which was read and referred to Messrs. Reynolds, Blake and Turner.

Mr. Dorsey delivers a bill entitled, an act authorising a lottery for the benefit of the Faculty of Physic in the University of Maryland; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Bennett delivers a bill entitled, an act to incorporate a charitable society in the town of Easton; Mr. Maulsby a bill entitled, an act for turnpiking the road from Baltimore to Belle Air, and licence to the scite fixed upon for a bridge over the river Susquehanna, near Rock Run; and Mr. Warner a bill entitled, an act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose of building a market house in the eastern precincts of Baltimore; which were severally read.
