The clerk of the senate delivers the bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to confirm a road in Harford and Baltimore counties; the bill entitled, an act for the support and maintenance of Fielder Moore of Anne Arundel county; the bill entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, an act to open and extend Pratt street in the city of Baltimore, passed at November session 1811, and the supplement thereto; the bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act passed at November session 1802, entitled, an act to incorporate certain persons in every christian church or congregation in this state; the bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act respecting the equity jurisdiction of the county courts; the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Jesse Jarrett, Henry Scarff and others; the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the infant heirs of Henry Brooke, of Montgomery county deceased; and the bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company for erecting a bridge over North East creek in Cecil county, severally endorsed, "will not pass." The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Jacob Medtart, of Frederick county; the bill entitled, an act to make public a road in Somerset county; the bill entitled, an act authorising Thomas Saulsbury, late sheriff and collector of Caroline county to complete his collections; the bill entitled, an act to lay out and make public a road in Cecil county; the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Mary Ann, Eliza and Francis Johnson; the bill entitled, an act to provide for transcribing certain wills, and a book of inventories, in the register's office of Saint Mary's county; the bill entitled, an act to enable the president directors and company of the Farmer's Bank of Maryland at Annapolis, and of the branch bank at Easton, to remove said banks in case of necessity and for other purposes; the bill entitled, an act to authorise the levy court of Baltimore county to levy and assess a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned; and the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Anne Mackie, severally endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for amending & reducing into system the laws and regulations concerning last wills and testaments, the duties of executors, administrators and guardians, and the rights of orphans and other representatives of deceased persons, endorsed, "will not pass." The bill entitled, an act authorising Robert Welch (of Ben.) collector of Anne Arundel county to complete his collections; the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Susan O'Harra, of Anne Arundel county; the bill entitled, an act authorising Edward Wilkins, late sheriff and collector of Kent county to complete his collections, severally endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read. Also a bill entitled, an act to authorise the justices of the levy court and orphan's court of Charles county, to grant permits to retailers of spirituous liquors, and ordinary keepers in certain cases; a bill entitled, an act for the advancement of justice; and a bill entitled, an act for building a bridge over North East Creek, in Cecil county, severally passed by the senate Jan. 26; which were read. Also the resolution in favor of Richard Waters, endorsed assented to, and the engrossed bills No. 1 to 80 inclusive endorsed "read and assented to."
