The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Isaac Baker, of Calvert county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Culbreth and Mr. Warner have leave of absence.

The bill entitled, an act relating to dogs in Allegany county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Bennett, the question was put, that he have leave of absence the remainder of the session ? Determined in the negative.

Mr. Kilgore delivers a petition from Greenbury Howard, of Montgomery county, praying that the levy court may be authorised to repay him certain monies advanced to Stephen Caywood ; which was read and referred to Messrs Kilgour, Crabb and Jones.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise the sale of certain property therein mentioned ; the bill entitled, an act authorising Wm. Clare, late collector of Calvert county, to complete his collection ; and the bill entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, an act for extending Green-street, in the city of Baltimore, were severally read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Kilgour delivers a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Greenbury Howard, of Montgomery county ; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

The amendments proposed by the senate to the bill entitled, an act to straighten and amend an old road in Washington county, were read the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The clerk of the senate delivers a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to authorise a lottery or lotteries to raise a sum of money to make a turnpike road from Frederick town to Harper's Ferry, and for other purposes, passed at November session, 1812, passed by the senate, Jan. 29 ; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and returned to the senate.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise the sale of certain real estate, held by Joseph B. M'Kean, in trust for the children of Andrew Buchanan, deceased, endorsed, " will not pass," and the following message :

BY THE SENATE, January 28, 1814.

*Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,*

The senate has negatived the bill passed by your house, entitled, an act to authorise the sale of certain real estate held by Joseph B. M'Kean, in trust for the children of Andrew Buchanan, deceased. This bill is founded upon a representation that the legal title to the land which is therein provided to be sold is in Joseph B. M'Kean, in trust for the children of Andrew Buchanan, deceased. Whereas it appears by the copy of the deed annexed to the petition, that no legal estate passed from Thomas M'Kean to Joseph B. M'Kean, under that deed, it having been acknowledged by the grantor before two aldermen of the city of Philadelphia, in the state of Pennsylvania, and not according to the laws of this state. The legal title to the land described in the bill consequently remains in Thomas M'Kean, one of the petitioners, who has full power to dispose of it, without the authority of this legislature.

Also a bill entitled, an act to ascertain the allowance of sheriffs, for performing the duties required of them respecting elections, and a bill entitled, an act relating to flour now lying within the city and port of Baltimore, passed by the senate, Jan. 29 ; which were severally read the first and second time by special order passed and returned to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill entitled, an act to make public an old road in Frederick county ; the bill entitled, an act to confirm an act entitled, an act to alter, change and repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government of this state, as relate to the division of Prince George's county, into election districts ; the bill entitled, an act authorising and directing the sale of the real estate of Wm. Hammond, (son of Wm.) late of Anne-Arundel county, deceased, severally endorsed, " will not pass." The bill entitled, an act to ascertain the allowance to be made by the levy court of Washington county, to the sheriffs thereof, for elections in the said county, heretofore had or hereafter to be had ; and the bill entitled, an act authorising a lottery for the benefit of the faculty of physic in the University of Maryland, severally endorsed, " will not pass." Also the bill entitled, an act authorising the erection of a fire proof building for the safekeeping of the public and records of Frederick county, the bill entitled an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Edward H. Clavert's old mill, in Prince George's county to the district of Columbia ; the bill entitled, an act to incorporate a Charitable Society in the Town of Easton ; the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Abner Neale, Francis Wills and John Cole, of the city of Baltimore ; the bill entitled, an act for the relief of James Chalmers and Alexis Romain, of the city of Baltimore, and the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Washington Blanket and Woolen Manufacturing Company, of Prince George's county, severally endorsed, " will pass." Ordered to be engrossed.

The bill from the senate entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to regulate and discipline the militia of this state, was read the second time, and on motion by Mr. Plater, the question was put, that the following section be stricken out, viz :
