The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Richard Newman of Kent county, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

*Amendment proposed.*

At the end of the bill add "And be it enacted, that any deed or deeds which have been executed by the said Richard Newman for alienating, transferring or conveying any real property, shall have the same force and effect as if he had been naturalized at the time of making and executing the same."

The bill entitled, an act to authorise the corporation of the city of Annapolis to repair certain wharves; and the bill entitled, an act authorising John Ireland, late sheriff of Calvert county to complete his collections, were severally read the second time, passed, and with the bill entitled, an act to give validity and operation to a deed therein mentioned; and the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Jacob Medtart of Frederick county, sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Richard Thompson of Saint Mary's county; the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Valinda Wonnen Conaway of the city of Annapolis; and the bill entitled, an act authorising the levy court of Anne-Arundel county to assess a sum of money for the maintenance of Rebecca Lee and her eight children, were severally read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Ann and Mary Chewsick, daughters of Anne Strong of Saint Mary's county; a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to regulate and discipline the militia of this state; a bill entitled, an act authorising Wm. P. Ridgaway late sheriff of Queen Ann's county to complete his collection; a bill entitled, an act to authorise Wm. Vincent of Charles county to remove and bring into this state certain negroes; a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Nelly White of Worcester county; a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the children of Henry Miles of Somerset county, severally passed by that house Janr. 10. 1814; and the following resolution:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Janr. 10, 1814

Whereas, by an act entitled, an act relating to the governor and council of this state, passed at the last session, one month's additional service was imposed on the executive of this state, and whereas it is just and right that the governor and the members of the executive council should be paid for the performance of this additional service; *Therefore resolved*, That the treasurer of the western shore pay out of any unappropriated money in the treasury to his excellency the governor, the members of the council, the clerk and messenger to the council for their services during the month above mentioned, the one twelfth part of the annual salaries which by the laws of this state the governor and council, the clerk and messenger to the council respectively are entitled to receive.

THE Senate met.—Present the same members as on yesterday.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise and direct the sheriff of Cecil county to execute a deed or deeds therein mentioned, was read the second time and will not pass, sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act relating to the supervisors and overseers of the public roads in the several counties in this state, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for incorporating a society by the name of the Saint Andrew's Society of Baltimore, was read the second time, and will not pass, sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion the question was put, will the senate reconsider the amendments to the bill entitled, an act explanatory and supplemental to an act respecting the bringing of slaves from the District of Columbia into this state? Resolved in the affirmative.

The amendments being read, the question was put, will the senate recede therefrom? Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Ann and Mary Chewsick daughters of Anne Strong of Saint Mary's county; and the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Nelly White of Worcester county, were severally read the second time by special order and will not pass.

The bill entitled, an act to lay out and make public a road therein mentioned in Cecil county, was read the second time by special order, and will pass with the proposed amendment.
