

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill entitled, an act to confirm and make valid the last will and testament of William M. Creery, late of Baltimore county, deceased, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed. And the following message:

Mr. Ford delivers a petition from Mary Ford, widow of George N. Ford deceased, praying that a law may pass authorising the sale of certain lands belonging to her infant children. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Ford, Stonestreet and Jenkins.

Mr. Claude delivers a petition from Robert Welch of Ben. collector of Anne Arundel county, praying further time to complete his collection. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Claude, Duvall and Hopkins.

Mr. Worthington delivers a petition from Ralph Basil of the city of Annapolis, praying that the levy court may be authorised to levy a sum of money for the support of himself and family. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Worthington, Claude, Dorsey, Hood and Hopkins.

On motion by Mr. Kilgour, the following message was read, agreed to, and sent to the senate:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, January 5, 1815.

Gentlemen of the senate,

We have received your message agreeing to appoint on this day, directors in the several banks on the part of this state, by joint ballot, and are ready to proceed forth with to the election.

We have nominated as directors of the Union Bank of Maryland, Richard K. Heath and Washington Hall; for the Mechanics Bank of Baltimore, Christopher Raborg Junr. and George Taylor; for the Commercial and Farmers Bank of Baltimore, Edward Harris; for the Farmers Bank of Maryland, at Annapolis, Thomas H. Bowie and Daniel Murray; for the Branch of said Bank at Easton, Tench Tighman and James Price; for the Hagers Town Bank, Joseph McIlheny and John Harry; for the Elkton Bank of Maryland, Wm. Alexander. Messrs. Kilgour and Beard are appointed by this house, to join the gentlemen named by your house, to count the ballots and report thereon.

Mr. Barney from the committee delivers the following report:

The committee to whom was referred the petition of Mountjoy Bayly of the District of Columbia, beg leave to report: That they have had the same under their serious consideration, and believing the facts therein stated to be true, and the money he received under a resolution of November session 1810, to be a full compensation in lieu of half pay as authorised by congress; they therefore beg leave to submit the following resolution:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed and required to pay to Mountjoy Bayly late a captain in the revolutionary war, or to his order, the sum of five hundred dollars, as a full compensation for the land to which he was entitled for his services during the revolutionary war from the state of Maryland.

Which was read.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, Ordered, that the bill, entitled a further supplement to the act entitled an act for regulating the mode of staying executions and repealing the acts of assembly therein mentioned and for other purposes, be the order of the day for to morrow.

Mr. Claude delivers a bill, entitled, an act authorising Robert Welch, of Ben. collector of Anne Arundel county to complete his collections. Which was read.

Mr. Dallam delivers a petition from Philip Chamberlain of Harford county, praying that a law may pass to authorise the recording of a certain deed. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Dallam, Bradford and Dorsey.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill, entitled, an act to regulate the proceedings of sheriffs and constables in certain cases, endorsed, "will not pass;" the resolution in favor of the trustees of St Peter's free school in the city of Baltimore, endorsed, "assented to;" and a bill entitled, an act to lay out and open a road in Cecil county, passed January 5, 1815.

Also a communication from the register of the Western Shore land office, containing a representation of the state of the public records of his office, and accompanied by an account of taxes received in his office to the 8th of December last. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Duvall, Lecompte and Dorsey.

Mr. Van Horn from the committee to whom was referred, the bill from the senate, entitled, an act relative to justices of the peace, and for other purposes, reports the said bill with certain amendments, which were read, and on motion by Mr. Dorsey, ordered to be printed.
