MONDAY, *January 16.*

The house met. Present the same members as on Saturday, except the honorable Speaker, Mr. Van Horn and Mr. Randall.

The house proceeded to the election of a Speaker pro tem and the ballots being deposited in the ballot box, on examination thereof it appeared that J. H. Thomas, Esquire, was elected. Mr. Thomas accordingly took the chair. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

Mr. Kilgour delivers a bill entitled, an act to empower Burgess Willett, executor of Robert W. Fleming, late sheriff and collector of Montgomery county, to collect fees and county tax put into his hands for collection during his life time. And Mr. Barney a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road leading to Cumberland, and for the extension of the charters of the several banks in the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes. Which were severally read.

Mr. M'Donald delivers a bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower the justices of the Levy court of Caroline county, to discontinue so much of the public road as is therein mentioned. Which was read the first and second time by special order, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to alter and change the name of Elizabeth town in Washington county, to Hagers town, and to incorporate the same, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The amendments proposed by the senate to the bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act for the relief of the poor of Queen Ann's county, were read the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. Lecompte delivers a petition from Thomas Simmons, and others of Dorchester county, praying that a law may pass to prohibit the setting of seins in certain rivers therein mentioned. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Lecompte, Bayly and Spencer.

Mr. Spencer delivers a bill entitled, an act to regulate the breadth of a certain road in Kent county. Which was read the first and second time by special order, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Kell delivers a petition from Thomas M'Kean, and Joseph B. M'Kean, of Pennsylvania, praying that they may be authorised to sell certain lands for the benefit of the infant children of Andrew Buchanan. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Kell, Wilson and Mason.

The amendments proposed by the senate to the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the widow and heirs of William Holland, of Montgomery county, were read the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The report on the petition of Jacob Gibson, was read the second time, concurred in, and the resolution therein contained, assented to, and sent to the senate.

The bill from the senate entitled, an act to incorporate the Bellona gun powder company of Maryland, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate certain persons in every Christian church, or congregation in this state, passed at November session, 1802, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The amendments proposed by the senate to the bill entitled, an act to lay out and make public a road in Cecil county, were read the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.
