

Amendments proposed.

- 1st. After the word "aforesaid" in the third line of the second page, insert "or a majority of them."
 2d. At the end of the bill add, "And be it enacted, that the commissioners, before they proceed to act, shall take an oath before some justice of the peace that they will without favor or affection, prejudice or partiality, value and assess the damages sustained by any person or persons through whose land the said road shall pass agreeably to the provisions of this act. And if any of the commissioners herein named shall die, resign or refuse to act, the remaining commissioners or a majority of them shall be and they are hereby authorised to supply such vacancy by appointing another person or persons.

The bill entitled, "an act to lay out, open and establish a road in Washington county," was read the second time, passed and sent the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs of John Hesselins, late of Alleghany county, deceased," passed by that house January 7, 1815. A bill entitled, "an act for the benefit of Thomas Noble, James Handcock, Eli Perdue, William Beachboard, Robert Bell, John Roberson, Alexander Richardson, and Sarah Handcock, widow of John Handcock, of Worcester county, deceased." A bill entitled, "a supplement to an act entitled, an act to encourage the education of youth in Worcester county." A bill entitled, "an act relative to cases in the court of appeals." A bill entitled, "an act for the benefit of James Morrison, sear. of Alleghany county." A bill entitled, "an act relating to the several banks within this state." A bill entitled, "a supplement to the act entitled, an act to establish a bank in the city of Baltimore, to be called the City Bank of Baltimore," severally passed by that house January 9, 1815. Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. Also returns the bill entitled, "a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the benefit of James Gouty, Mary Gouty, Lucretia Gouty and John Stevens Gouty, orphan children of Zachariah Gouty, late of Caroline county, deceased," passed by that house January 9, 1815. Ordered to be engrossed. Likewise delivers the following resolution:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, January 7, 1815.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed to pay to Richard Waters, late a captain in the Maryland line, or to his order annually, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a captain, as a further remuneration for the services rendered his country during the revolutionary war. Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

TUESDAY, January 10.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, "an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act for the relief of the poor of Queen Ann's county," was read the second time, and will pass with the proposed amendment.

After the word "paid" in the eighth line of the second page, insert "out of said six hundred dollars and" Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The president laid before the senate a letter from Mr. James Nabb, signifying his acceptance of his appointment as senator.

Mr. Stephen presented the petition of Baruch Fowler and others, praying that a law may pass authorising a sale of the land therein mentioned. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Stephen, Brown and Worthington to consider and report thereon.

The bill entitled, "an act for the relief of Samuel McClellan and George H. Seckel, of the city of Baltimore," was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, "an act to alter and repeal such parts of the constitution and form of government of this state as relate to the division of Alleghany county into election districts," and the bill entitled, "an act for repairing the bridge over Tuckahoe creek near Hillsborough," were severally read the second time and will not pass; sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, "an act authorising Robert Welch of Ben. collector of Anne Arundel county, to complete his collections." A bill entitled, "an act for the benefit of James Hopkins, of Queen Ann's county," severally passed by that house January 9, 1815. A bill entitled, a supplement to the act passed at December session eighteen hundred and thirteen, chapter one hundred and eighteen, entitled, an act to prohibit the collection of certain wharfages within the city of Baltimore. A bill entitled, "an act to make valid a deed therein mentioned," severally passed by that house January 10, 1815, and the following resolution:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, January 9, 1815.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Charles Garner, of Charles county, a corporal in captain Gray's company of militia, or to his order, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a corporal during his life, in consideration of his being disabled by a wound received while in actual service, agreeably to the provisions of an act passed at May session eighteen hundred and thirteen, entitled, "an act providing for the calling of and detaching the militia of this state, and for other purposes.
