The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Mary Mayhew, Rachel Danison, and an afflicted child of Sarah Locker, of Prince George's county, was read the second time, amended and passed.

The house according to the order of the day proceeded to the second reading of the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to authorise the filling up and extending of certain lots on the south side of the basin in the city of Baltimore, and after some time spent therein, the further consideration thereof was postponed until to morrow.

FRIDAY, January 19.

The House met: Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, an act authorising the Levy court of Prince George's county, to levy annually on said county money for the support of sundry persons as out pensioners. The bill entitled, an act to authorise the drawing of a lottery for the benefit of the West Nottingham Academy in Cecil county. The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Samuel Lukins of Montgomery county; and the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road leading to Cumberland, and for the extension of the charters of the several banks in this state, and for other purposes, were sent to the senate.

The resolutions requesting the Legislature of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania to interpose its authority relative to preventing the employment or harboring of run away negroes by the citizens of the said commonwealth, were read the second time, assented to and sent to the senate.

The bill entitled, an act to revive and amend an act entitled, an act for establishing a company for opening and extending the navigation of the river Pocomoke, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Davidson delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Harford county, praying that a law may pass appointing commissioners in Cecil and Harford counties, and in the city and county of Baltimore to open books for subscriptions to raise a sum of money to make a turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to the site fixed upon for the bridge at Keer's Islands. Which was read and referred to the committee appointed on petitions of a similar nature.

Mr. Hughes delivers a petition from Samuel A. Kempton of the city of Baltimore, praying a special act of insolvency. Which was read and referred to the committee appointed on the petition of Joseph Bruff. A petition from Barker and Davis, counter to the petition of David A. Northrop. Which was read and referred to the committee appointed on the petition to which it is counter. A memorial from the stockholders of the insurance company of Maryland, praying for an increase of their capital. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Hughes, W. Steuart and E. G. Williams; And a petition from John Cornthwait of the city of Baltimore, praying a special act of insolvency. Which was read and referred to the committee appointed on the petition of Joseph Bruff.

Mr. Forwood delivers a petition from Henry P. Ruff of Harford county, praying for the recording of a certain deed executed by Peter Gerard to Daniel Ruff. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Forwood, Sewell and Hall.

Mr. Bowles delivers a petition from Benjamin Harwood, treasurer of the Western Shore, praying compensation for packing up and removing the Records and papers of his office during the late war. Which was read and referred to the committee of claims.

Mr. Calvert from the committee delivers the following report:

The committee to whom was referred the petition of Thomas R. Hodges and Benjamin Lee, have had the same under consideration, and find that the said Thomas R. Hodges was a surgeon to the seventeenth regiment of the militia of Maryland, and that the said Zachius Davis being a militia man under his care, his account for attending the said Davis ought to have been exhibited to the executive of this state. Your committee therefore recommend that the petitioners have leave to withdraw their petition and the account accompanying the same.
